# A View from Ryedale House



Last night, following an extraordinary planning meeting at Ryedale House, the green light was given to the 'Eden Camp agri-business park' proposal. Although there remain a number of hurdles yet to jump, this represents the first, and perhaps most important, step towards the construction of a project that has the potential to not only safeguard the livestock market but also create over 800 local jobs. In order to drive it forward, we must now work hard to persuade the Local Enterprise Partnership to lend it much needed financial support.

At the same time, we are seeing large scale residential housing development proposals coming forward. Recognising that there is both a serious housing shortfall and that many (mainly young) people are being 'priced off the ladder,' I support the need for new home building in principle. However, the greatest care

Weaverthorpe War Memorial by Candle light 2200hrs to 2300hrs 4 August 2014 one hundred years on from 4/8/1914. It has stood as a silent sentinel since it was unveiled by Lady Sykes of Sledmere in 1922 to the Named young lads of Weaverthorpe who left never to return. The Wolds Waggoners got there telegrams in the harvest fields on the 6th of August 1914 and with in a week were in France, they were one of only two units in the British Army ever to go to war with no military training what so ever. It is all so a place where local former service personnel can go and reflect on their comrades who lie in places far from home be they Sailors Marines Army or Royal Air Force. It is only in resent years that fallen service personal have been brought home, before that they were interred where they

The Memorial Cross and the surrounded grassed area is a listed and protected Memorial that belongs to the Village and it is my wish and hope that the people of Weaverthope present and future will respect that, and that it stays where it is for the next century so that the residents of Weaverthorpe can once again say thanks to the lads that fell in 1914/18 and 1939/45

Memorial is a place where we can go and reflect and remember those that lie as the poem says "That there's some corner of a foreign field. That is for ever England" and should be cherish and revered by all Chris Howe

**Dog Fouling**We're supporting Safer Ryedale and their **"Take the lead...** Take the Bag" campaign against dog mess. You'll be seeing the posters displayed in Helperthorpe, West Lutton and East Lutton. We have some dog fouling reporting slips "Seen it? Report it!" or you can report dog fouling offences direct to the Dog Warden, Brian Dunn.

However, before doing so, please understand the limits of the Dogs [Fouling of Land] Act.  $\;$  It covers only roads, footpaths, verges and public places, [such as playing fields, playgrounds, village greens, church grounds and grave yards] within a speed restriction of 40mph or less. Fines cannot be imposed for dog fouling along unrestricted roads between villages or in open countryside. We know that dog mess is an issue that generates strong feelings amongst many residents and would ask that all dog owners keep our footpaths and verges clean, whether or not they are within a 40mph speed limit. Please Bag It and Bin It!
