A View from County Hall



I have no doubt that if I had to place a bet on what would be the top whinge of the Wolds, potholes and the state of our roads would come very near the top of the list. Last month our Leader wrote personally to the Transport Secretary Patrick McLoughlin to ask for help with the cost of repairs – particularly to our network of minor roads so vital to our rural infrastructure. At the budget meeting, we set aside £5m from our reserves towards the cost of repairs and Cllr Weighell has appealed for the Government to consider matching this funding.

The Department for Transport have now announced that North Yorkshire's share of 'exceptional funding' of £183m 'to help with much needed road repairs following the wettest winter on record' will be £3.2m. Nationally, the money is designed to pay for repairs to some 3.3 million potholes. In addition, we hope to receive further funding from a £200m 'pothole repair fund' announced by the Chancellor yesterday in his budget.

How on earth do families cope when they are trying to raise their children in an area where there is armed conflict? The cost to that family is so hard for us to even imagine as so often they lose their homes, their farms, their villages, their health and sometimes even their lives.

Next month, the Churches in the Wolds Valley are joining in with Churches of all different denominations across this country this year to raise money to help those who are caught up in these conflicts in a week of Fundraising. Last year through Christian Aid Week churches helped to raise over £12 million and this year, in the Wolds Valley, we would like to help. One way we will do it is through the Christian Aid envelopes which someone will deliver through your door at the beginning of the week (11-17 May). You are invited to place a donation however small or large, in that envelope and then towards the end of the week someone will call to collect the envelope. Once all the money from the Wolds Valley has been collected together, it will be sent off to the Christian Aid

St Leonard & St Mary's RC Church, Malton

A Ryedale church has held three special services since the new year to mark the 10th anniversaries of the deaths of people.

The first of these services at St Leonard & St Mary's RC Church, Malton, remembered Malton Hospital worker Joanna Rookes who was struck and killed by a car while unloading suitcases from her own car outside a relative's house in Newbiggin after driving back from watching a match involving her beloved Celtic City Football Club.

Her relatives are also hoping to hold 10 events this year to mark the anniversary, the first of which was a quiz night at Suddabys in the town.

A trust was set up in her name with money going to refurbish the library at St Mary's RC Primary School where she had been a pupil.

The second service remembered Lydia Purcell who was just 12 years old when she was struck by a truck while crossing the Malton to Hovingham road at Broughton near where she lived. She died later at Leeds General Infirmary.

The talented schoolgirl attended All Saints School, York, after she left St Mary's RC Primary and a trust fund was also set up in her name to provide an award for students who excelled, as she had done, academically and musically.

Music written by Kirkbymoorside Graham Jones for her funeral was played at the service by three people including her mother.

The third service commemorated Prof Patrick Nuttgens, 74, who lived at Terrington and had helped to found York University and later Leeds Polytechnic. Prof Nuttgens was also described as a champion of good architecture and intelligent conservation, and a writer, broadcaster and artist.

He trained as an architect and in January 1962 became the first academic appointee to the new University of York, as director of the Institute of Advanced Architectural Studies, and later as professor of architecture.

The services were led by parish priest Father Tim Bywater. That year alone some 19 funerals were held at the church.

Masses at St Leonard & St Mary's take place at the weekend at 6.30 pm on Saturdays and 9.30 am on Sundays and various other services are held throughout the week.
