A View from County Hall



There may be some debate as to whether austerity has really ended but I am hopeful that we are moving in the right direction. Financial restrictions can often bring out creativity, and so I thought I would highlight a novel way of addressing flood defences in Ryedale.

Many of the villages I represent have a water course of some sort running through them. These range from Main Rivers status and little becks to the familiar Wolds Gypsy Race. Without exception they have all suffered from reduced maintenance as the purse strings have been tightened. This has led to associated problems, not least the potential to cause flooding. Owners of land and properties that abut water courses have a riparian duty to maintain the water course but maintenance can be difficult especially when there are multiple owners including the Highways Authority.

The "Slow the Flow" project, was a new and innovative approach to damming the river with woody debris to prevent flooding lower downstream, but funding for maintenance was not factored in. We will shortly be seeing a strictly regulated "Enclosed Beaver Release Trial" to see if the beavers can undertake this vital maintenance job. It's worth noting that beavers are actually vegetarians so this project is right on trend. Now I am not suggesting that all land owners consider this option and let me make it quite clear, this is all done under licence, strictly regulated and contained. I simply find it fascinating that the reintroduction of a native species has the potential to do our maintenance jobs for us. Whilst the rest of the country are considering Robotics to do their work, Ryedale are getting nature herself to do what she always did.

Finally, as the District council elections draw near, I am sure you would all want me to pass on our thanks to Tharik Jainu-Deen for representing the Wolds ward at Ryedale district council over the last four years.

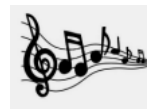
