These are the plans we have in place to ensure that in the event of an emergency, service delivery continues and ensures that the most vulnerable in our society are cared for. These plans have now been enhanced to take account of the latest global COVID-19 outbreak. We have taken the lead for broad partnership preparation and planning including multi-agency meetings with Public Health England, the NHS and District Councils.

I have been very moved by the generous offers of help received including everything from accommodation and food preparation to young people willing to give their time

to support the older generation - what a fantastic community we live in and thank you all for stepping up to this unprecedented challenge. It's important to remember that at the moment although it may seem very difficult, we are not a community in crisis and as such, it is better to plan carefully than be reactionary. nothing is happening and so I wanted to reassure you that we are working hard to co-ordinate offers of help. This is being undertaken by our Stronger Communities team which was originally set up to fill in the gaps left by a shrinking council budget. This team have now been directed towards dealing with the effects of Covid-19 at a specifically local level and as such, they are building a structure from which the established voluntary sector can work within and where individuals and "pop up" groups can pool recourses sustainably. It is important that we identify vulnerable people within our community and you at street level are instrumental in doing this. Sadly, Police and Local Government have warned that people are already being targeted by scammers exploiting the crisis, such as by impersonating health officials, by offering to collect food or medicines, or by selling counterfeit supplies. I will soon be posting details of the approved voluntary services set up in our area however, if you need help now, please ask a relative, trusted friend or neighbour in the first instance. Perhaps you are a member of a local club or church group that have set up volunteers for the most vulnerable. The county council customer

service centre is now set up to provide support for those people who have nobody and find themselves in desperate need of help. This can be accessed by calling our hotline on 01609 780780 where the team will sign post you to the right support and ensure you are provided with the care you need. If you would like to talk to me direct to raise a concern, my contact details are below.

I will of course continue to keep you informed on this rapidly changing situation.

Take care, stay safe, follow the Government guidance and we will get through this.

It was decided to postpone the Mother's Day Mass scheduled for Friday March 20 at St Mary's RC Primary School, Malton, due to the ongoing situation regarding the Coronavirus. The school is connected to St Leonard & St Mary's RC Church, Malton, and Mass will be celebrated later in the year.

World Day of Prayer: Thanks to all who supported the World Day of Prayer Service at St Leonard & St Mary's RC Church especially those who worked behind the scenes.

The Churches Together in South Rye dale weekly Lent Lunches held in Malton and Norton churches each year in aid of Christian aid have been cancelled. It is hoped that there will be an event later in the year to support Christian Aid.

The Easter Fair in Pickering on March 28 has had to be cancelled as the RVS centre is having to close due to the epidemic.

Ryedale Christian Council, conscious of the threat to participants, has postponed its Climate Change Conference on April 25 at Lady Lumley's, Pickering. It is hoped to be able to re-schedule the conference for early November although this date will depend on the progress of the virus.

An organiser said: "We regret this postponement and the inconvenience caused but believe it to be the right decision."

Also cancelled was the Paddy's Night music session at the Steam and Moorland Garden Centre, Pickering, on Friday (March 20) and also the Ampleforth Abbey, Schola 50th Anniversary Concert on Saturday.

At the weekend we announced that The Blue Bell Inn would look to offer our a takeaway service. This would be to both support our local community and our business financially in terms of revenue... However, after careful consideration, we have decided that we will no longer be offering a takeaway for at least two weeks (we'll review the situation on an ongoing basis). The next week or two it seems are CRITICAL if we are to suppress COVID-19.

Why not? The simple reason is because even with all our efforts to deep clean, wash, sanitise and maintain social distancing, we simply do not have the in-depth knowledge, understanding or tools to reassure either ourselves or our customers that we are in 'control' of the virus. To offer a takeaway service, would, we feel, be the wrong thing to do right now. There is a great deal of information and misinformation out there but we do not know with total certainty which is correct or misleading. For example, we have been informed that the virus can be spread via packaging...it's simply a risk we are not prepared to take!

Our priority is to safeguard ourselves, the vulnerable and those who live in the community Only then, with every effort to prevent the spread of this horrible disease, can we at least say that we did our utmost help save lives, prevent the spread, and get back to some sort of normality.

We ask for your continued understanding on this and cannot emphasise enough just how important this should be to us all...

If you do not already have someone who can deal with all the things you need then we have created a single point of contact though which we should be able to deal with your situation.

Things we can possibly help you with:

 collecting and delivering shopping – leaving deliveries on the doorstep or safe place to avoid close physical contact;

- suggesting local shopping options and trusted suppliers e.g.
- collecting and delivering prescriptions if you are the nominated person registered with the GP;
- caring for pets;

- regular social contact via telephone, FaceTime, Skype calls or other methods that will avoid physical
 contact (offering to call your neighbour who can't get out so they have someone to chat to on the
 phone could make all the difference);
- encouraging people to contact others in the same situation by linking people together;
- delivering books and magazines or materials to support hobbies such as wool for knitting or art materials;
- reassuring people with accurate and up to date advice and information;
- signposting people to other sources of help if needed;
- collection or delivery of library books
- help with schoolwork;
- collection and delivery of local Take-Away Meals;
- facilities for obtaining cash;
- taking items to the Post Office or collecting items from the Post office Delivery Point
- anything that you think may assist you just let us know and we will see what can be arranged.

Remember – Coronavirus is contagious. Please take every precaution to ensure that you are spreading only kindness. Avoid physical contact – stay at least 2m from each other. Wash your hands regularly.

Any items either collected or delivered will be left on your doorstep.
