

A View from Ryedale House




For the moment, news from Ryedale District Council is limited. There are some reviews in progress, however, until these have been completed and councillors have had an opportunity to consider the results, there is little to say.

However, the chair of West Luttons Parish Council brought to my attention an issue that could have an impact for all residents in this region. A review is currently being undertaken for the future delivery of healthcare services by the Scarborough & Ryedale Clinical Commissioning Group and York Commissioning Group.

consideration is that Scarborough Hospital would provide Accident & Emergency Services, maternity and

pediatric services. The other services could then be relocated to York Hospital. In gauging the public's reactions to proposals, attendees at a recent meeting were asked if they would be willing to travel a little further for a better clinical outcome. At face value, this in itself is not unreasonable given that healthcare budgets are under pressure. However, there are practical considerations that also need to be taken into account.

This could involve a stay, and for visiting family members, it could mean anything up to an 80-mile round trip, additional time, expense and disruption to family life. During Wintertime, weather conditions could become a major consideration.

There will be additional consultations, and I would recommend that residents take an interest in any proposals that are put forward as well as expressing their views.

Weaverthorpe War Memorial

Weaverthorpe War Memorial was unveiled in September 1922 by Lady Sykes, in commemoration of six local servicemen who died during the First World War. Following the Second World War an inscription was added to commemorate three men who had died during that conflict. A further name from the First World War was added a few years ago. It is a Grade 2 listed monument and is particularly relevant given the commemorations of battles in the First World War which have had their centenaries in the recent past.

The land on which the Memorial stands is maintained by a volunteer from the Parish Council and is kept in a manner that befits its importance.

On Remembrance Day each year there is a service held at the Memorial at which the Poppy Wreath is laid and in recent years Poppy replicas are laid on behalf of the children in the Village, the two minutes silence is observed and The Last Post is played.

Attendees at the service on 12th November 2017 were appalled by damage caused by horse shoes to the carefully maintained grass around the Memorial. The Parish Council, at their meeting on 20th November 2017, asked that an article be put in the Warbler to ask horse riders in or passing through the village to respect the site and not to allow their horses on to the grass on the War Memorial Site.


