A View from County Hall



I write this piece on the train returning from the three day National Children and Adult Services Conference in Manchester. This is a stimulating conference with topical presentations and lively debates on adult and children's social care, issues close to the hearts of all our communities.

Presentations from both the Children and Families Minister and Minister for Health and Social Care were rigorously challenged on the looming funding crisis for local government. North Yorkshire was referred to several times as an exemplar of their innovative work in children's services, however our director was quick to point out

that even though we have made responsible efficiencies and transformed services, we still face a projected £11 million overspend in our children's social care budget. We welcomed the one off money directed to us in the recent autumn budget, but sustainable services are predicated on core funding and not one off windfalls.

Clearly the DfE have now got the message but rightly need to base their spending review on "what

works" and this is challenging when it comes to evaluating work such as Prevention. Overall the mood was positive and as is usually the case, the networking and exchange of ideas at the edge of the conference was as valuable as the formal sessions.

Christmas will be almost upon us by the time this is published, so may I wish you all a happy festive season and best wishes for the New Year.
