Cold Snaps, Warm Homes Weaverthorpe Parish Council



Following on from the project named last year, when Weaverthorpe Parish Council worked with Rural Action Yorkshire to provide thermal images of the homes in the village, we have now

secured a small amount of money as a Community Grant to enable us to provide fuel to any member of the community that cannot afford to buy fuel over the winter months.

If anyone is in this position they should contact the Chair or the Clerk, (details below). We will then liaise on a confidential basis with two parish councillors who have responsibility for the grant.

Applications will be limited to one per household and will be dealt with on a first come first served basis. As this money has been allocated to us by a charity it will be necessary to check your eligibility to receive this help.

HGV parking in the layby at the w est end of W eaverth or pe



During 2015 and 2016 Weaverthorpe Parish Council received a number of complaints from residents and users of the village hall saying that HGV's were using the layby opposite the village hall as an overnight lorry park. Parish Councillors received reports of drivers and companions defecating in the layby and on the track adjacent to it. Complaints were also received from residents that the HGV's parked, sometimes for a full weekend, were running their engines to heat the cab throughout the night. Others reported problems that people using the village hall could not park in the layby when events were held there. In conjunction with NYCC Highways Department we agreed to plant a hedge across the layby in order to prevent HGVs parking there. Additionally NYCC agreed that they would level the area after the hedge was planted as there were two large puddles there which also made parking difficult. We placed an article in the Warbler in June last year explaining what we intended to do and why we were doing it.

The nedge has been planted and NYCC are looking at the levelling out. No taxpayer's money has been spent as we secured a grant to pay for the materials and members of the Council gave their time to do the work. We are evaluating the su coess of this initiative and have a planned meeting with the local company that most of the HGV's visit in an endeavour to resolve remaining problems.

More recently we have had complaints that some drivers are now not able to turn around, as they use the layby for those manoeuvres, but there are other safe places to turn in the village and beyond, so, although inconvenient for some we feel that there are alternatives.
