In effect, we have no local voice because where the Local Plan is

out of date then the National Plantakes its place.

Planning can be a very emotive topic, but the policies within the MWJP are made in a non adversarial environment allowing structured debate and a negotiated stance to be formed between all stakeholders including you as residents. How quick we are to form campaign groups but reluctant to respond to consultations.

There are some who seek to use the MWJP a tool to stop "Hydraulic fracturing" in North Yorkshire. The plan contains important policies for oil and gas, and as NYCC is the first local authority to put forward a development plan containing policies for unconventional gas, you can be sure that all eyes will be watching us. However when a local plan is misused in this manner, there is a danger that policies for other important developments such as land fill, quarries and incineration, simply get thrown out with the bathwater.
