scale, presence and blade movement of ten alien 126ft high turbines would have drawn the eye, dwarfed and dominated the area for miles around and blighted an extraordinary and stunning landscape immortalised by, amongst others, David Hockney, arguably our greatest living artist.

Finally, I am delighted to see that Duggleby awarded a Council grant to support its 'green-fingered' community garden. If any other community-based organisation or group needs

The scheme enables people to have books, audio books, music, and even DVD's, specifically chosen for them and delivered to them in their own home. The service is particularly useful for those who may be disabled, or who may find mobility difficult, and is also available for carers benefiting both the carer and the person they care for. Customers can join the scheme on a temporary or permanent basis. This can be ideal especially during the winter months when getting out and about may be difficult.

The service is FREE and, initially, being offered to residents in Butterwick, Weaverthorpe, Helperthorpe, and the Luttons.
