As we emerge from the height of the pandemic and restrictions are gradually lifted, we are all trying hard to establish some structure in the new norm. New ways of shopping socialising, working and learning that will help us return to normality safely. Increasingly, is becoming apparent that the struggle to balance Health with Economy are proving to be a greater challenge moving out of lockdown than when we went in.
