## View from County Hall

At NYCC I sit on two planning committees, the main committee deals with minerals and waste - all the big boys stuff, quarries, HWRC ("tips" to you and I) and of course gas. We are at present updating our minerals and waste plan which is a joint policy with City of York and North Yorkshire Moors National Parks.

The other committee is the Planning and Regulatory Functions Sub Committee which is made up of five members sitting in a

quasi-judicial capacity. We look at disputed rites of way, the record of which is kept on the 'Definitive Map and Statement' which we have a statutory duty to maintain. The committee make a recommendation, but ultimately the final

> decision has to be confirmed by

the secretary of state.

Currently there are 306 applications outstanding and the team are only able to process about 50 per annum. In addition, we get about 33 new applications a year so in effect, we are paddling backwards! It has been suggested that officers are given delegated decision making powers bypassing the lengthy committee process. I can see the benefit of this change as we should be able to get through more work and clear the backlog, however it does remove yet another layer of local democratic accountability.

Public services are now cutting into the bone and it is clear we will have to take more responsibility at local level. We can't stop these changes, but we can ensure we are geared up to working a positive way through them.


