Last week was our budget meeting at NYCC. The intense media publicity around the social care precept ensured that this issue featured heavily in our debates. We finally agreed an increase in general council tax of 1.99% and a 2% social care precept, alongside a continued programme of savings that will see our spending power reduced by more than a third over the course of this decade.
