# A View from Ryedale House

By the time you read this article, it is anticipated that Ryedale District Council will have agreed on a rise of £5.00 to its share of the annual Council Tax for the period 2018 to 2019. This will increase Ryedale District Council's current share which is £186.05 to £191.05, representing an increase of around 2.7%. By the time North Yorkshire County Council have included their increase along with the police and fire service precepts, residents in a Band D house could see an increase of approximately £80 a year.

The search for a new Chief Executive for Ryedale Council continues. There were no applications for the post at the close of the initial search period which was open to Ryedale Council employees. The Council is now considering other options including a

possible collaboration with North Yorkshire County Council. However, we are at an exploratory stage and will need the ratification of the Full Council before progressing any further.

The above option does have advantages as there are already many shared services between Ryedale District Council and North Yorkshire County Council.

Finally, I have a meeting planned for early next month with our Local MP Kevin Hollinrake to discuss the proposed changes by York CCG to healthcare services that affect our region. These could have an unwelcome impact, and I will advise of any developments.



### Community Speed Watch - Weaverthorpe

February 2018 marked the first anniversary of the Community Speed Watch team operating in Weaverthorpe. The team members are keen to let you know what we have achieved in that time.

When we started measuring the speed of vehicles through the village, we were consistently recording 20% of the vehicles exceeding the speed limit. We have recorded over 200 vehicles exceeding the speed limit in the first year. Nearly 25% of those 200 vehicles were travelling above 40 mph with quite a few travelling in the upper 40s! Our last three sessions have recorded between 2 % and 5% of vehicles exceeding the limit. So, we believe that we are having a positive effect on the overall situation. The scheme is not designed to catch as many speeders as possible. It is to reduce speeds and community fears, making drivers aware that excessive speed in areas with posted limits is socially unacceptable. We continue to get positive feedback from residents in the village and quite a number of drivers who stop and ask for more

information about what we do and how they can get Speed Watch in their villages. The team is made up of volunteers who give a few hours per month to carry out the deployments.
