

A View from Ryedale House



The result in the Scottish Independence referendum may have come as a relief to many but I predict that it will produce significant constitutional aftershocks for the UK as a whole. An English parliament is probably the only conclusive answer to the 'West Lothian' question, and with more powers (including tax-raising powers) devolved to Scotland, the more immediate becomes the need for one.

But what of the regions? I suspect that many of us may have forgotten about John Prescott's failed effort to introduce regional assemblies. In

2004 the north-east delivered their own emphatic verdict, with 80% voting against such a proposal. Why? Presumably because they feared an expensive talking shop with limited real power and populated by another tier of second-class politicians. For my part, I would welcome a greater devolution of decision-making to a local level, channeled through existing councils (vested in locally elected and accountable representatives) rather than face the expense of further tiers of government bureaucracy and infrastructure.



Home Improvement Agency awarded contract to operate Handyperson and Well Being Service

White Rose Home Improvement Agency (HIA) is celebrating being awarded a new three-year contract with North Yorkshire County Council so that it can continue to help older and vulnerable residents live independently in their own homes across the Borough of Scarborough and Ryedale.

White Rose HIA is a non-profit making partnership between Scarborough Borough Council and Ryedale District Council, which provides practical support and advice to enable people to remain independent in their own homes.

Speaking about the new contract, White Rose HIA Manager Lynn Williams said:

"People may have previously used Handyperson services operated by Broadacres and Age UK across the Borough of Scarborough and Ryedale; these services are now being operated by White Rose HIA. As part of the new contract we have retained the existing handypersons, Dave Rainton, Dave Parnaby and Gary Wright, so we're hoping these familiar faces will give our customers peace of mind and confidence in the service we provide."

The Handyperson service can carry out minor adaptations and small repairs jobs, usually lasting less than three hours, such as fitting shelves, smoke alarms, changing light bulbs, hanging pictures and many other items or small repairs.

Works cost £15 per hour, plus the cost of any materials, however some works may be free of charge. Anyone interested in the service can call 01723 232527 and staff will be happy to assist.

White Rose HIA also offers a free home based Well Being Service assessment that looks at factors like personal safety, including aids and adaptations that can assist with independence, improving a home's security and fire safety, benefits awareness, energy efficiency and identifying social and recreational activities to combat isolation and loneliness. 

Foxholes and Weaverthorpe Village Hall meeting

On Thursday 9 October John Nichols and David Mobbs, Foxholes Village Hall Committee members gave a presentation to the full Weaverthorpe Village Hall Committee outlining the plans for the new Foxholes Community Hall. They explained the need for the Hall, the process which Foxholes is going through to acquire Big Lottery Funding, the present plans for the Hall and how they see the Hall functioning. The Foxholes Community Hall is at the final stages of the Big Lottery funding process and it is the view of the Big Lottery that the new half a million pound Hall should serve the wider community of the Great Wolds Valley.

This meeting explored ways in which Weaverthorpe and Foxholes could co-operate and share ideas, resources and activities for the benefit of both communities.

Everyone thought the meeting was worthwhile with positive outcomes, and we are looking forward to working more closely together in the future.

Care and support where I live consultation

We would like the views of the people of North Yorkshire on proposals we have put together for transforming services to allow people to live independent, healthy and fulfilling lives. These proposals are based on the principle that people should be able to get care and support where they live and when they need it. Consultation background

North Yorkshire County Council's health and adult services' directorate has written a document to explain their proposals to transform the way they make sure that people can remain safe and independent in their own homes and improve the amount and quality of accommodation with care and support across the County by the year 2020. The proposals will also meet the financial savings that we need to make.

This strategy has been based on what you have told us; that older people want more control and choice over their support, want to live independent lives in their own homes and want to remain part of their local communities for longer. We also know that, by 2020, nearly a quarter of North Yorkshire's residents will be over 65 and the number of people predicted to have dementia will have increased by more than 20 per cent.

The proposals show that we will work with a wide range of partners and local communities to deliver better results for people and value for money.
