# A View from County Hall



Love them or hate them the issue of street lights in North Yorkshire is a complex one, so I hope my piece this month will bring you some enlightenment! Historically and generally NYCC own the lights that serve the roads and the footway lighting is owned by either the District or the Parish Councils. NYCC have contracts for some maintenance of PCs and District lighting. OK so you just want to know who to report to when a light doesn't work. The best way to do this is on line at www.northyorks.gov.uk/streetlighting

At our last NYCC Executive meeting we agreed an ambitious plan to replace the standard sodium street lighting with new LED technology. This may sound extravagant when funding is tight however NYCC maintains 50,400 streetlights in North Yorkshire, which cost about £2.1 million to power and £1.2 million to maintain every year. The new, more efficient LED equipment will cost about 40% less to power and it is anticipated that it will offer an annual saving of about £1.285 million on completion of the project. The new lights are more environmentally-friendly and will play an important part in reducing carbon emissions as well as helping to mitigate any future rises in electricity. It really does look like a classic

case of spend to save - money and the | environment.

Can you spare a couple of hours a week or fortnight to provide friendship to a person being cared for at home so their carer can have a bit of time for themselves? Ryed ale Carers Support is currently looking for volunteer

sitters for their free sitting service - Particularly those able to volunteer in the Sherburn, Rillington and Wolds area. The service has proven to be a lifeline for many local people. A volunteer sitter provides companionship for one or two hours a week or fortnight, which enables a carer to go out and visit friends, continue with a hobby or simply catch up on some much needed rest.

The charity's sitting service is free for carers as it is delivered by a team of dedicated volunteers, many of whom have been volunteering for the service for a number of years. The volunteers provide companionship but don't provide any medical or personal care – Their role is simply to provide friendly, supportive company and all travel expenses are met by the charity.

The charity welcomes people of any age, from all backgrounds, who can spare a couple of hours a week or fortnight to give a carer some much needed time for themselves.

'Without our fantastic volunteers we would not be able to provide this service,' says Sarah Lally-Marley, the charity's Community Development Worker, 'You can never underestimate the impact a volunteer can have on a carer's life.'
