A View from County Hall

I read in the papers that "Ryedale DC votes to reject government proposals on planning applications for fracking." I was at this meeting where there was an overwhelmingly vote to support local planning decisions being made by the relevant local planning authority. It's not my intention to open up a debate on hydraulic fracturing here but to look at some of the points behind the motion brought to the meeting.

Any application for the extraction of gas would be made by NYCC as the relevant planning authority and not the district councils. It was somewhat frustrating then,

that a hefty proportion of the meeting time was spent debating something that 1) we all unanimously agreed on, and 2) was not a power being removed from RDC. It also meant that very important local decisions such as the future of the Malton Livestock Market were pushed to the back of the agenda.

I have always argued that planning decisions should be keptin local hands primarily because a local committee understands the local issues and is able to put in planning conditions to mitigate potential problems arising from the development. This does however mean that the planning committee do have to be very brave when making decisions that adhere to local democratically produced planning policy, but are unpopular decisions.

One of the misconceptions raised was that the NYCC planning committee did not make a legitimate decision on the application for hydraulic fracturing at Kirby Misperton because it did not include a Ryedale member on the NYCC committee. It's worth pointing out that there is no Thornton Dale ward member on RDC planning committee, but the committee still makes decisions on development in the Thornton Dale ward, that is the nature of a committee system.

Finally, and as you would expect, despite the problems and great expense incurred by the last application for hydraulic fracking, NYCC members strongly support local decisions being kept with the relevant local planning authority.
