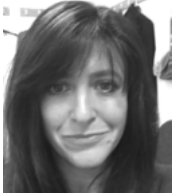

A View from Ryedale House



It has been a busy summer at Ryedale House, I have been getting to know the other Councillors and the new Council appears to be working well together.

I was pleased to be part of the Conservative Group who bought forward a motion to Full Council for a moratorium on fracking in Ryedale and it's success was through the efforts of cross-party working including supporting amendments put forward by the Liberal Democrat, Liberal and Independent Groups. The moratorium is indefinite but with the opportunity to be reviewed at any time as the picture changes and more information comes to light.

As part of my position on RDC Scrutiny Committee I volunteered to be on a Sub Group appointed to look into the effect Universal Credit has had on the residents in Ryedale. Previous experience both volunteering and working for Citizens Advice means I am fully aware of the difficulties people who rely on Universal Credit face and whilst I understand the reasons a new system was required from first hand experience and feedback received it has not been implemented well. If you have been affected by Universal Credit I would appreciate you getting in touch to enable me to build a clear picture on the way it has impacted Ryedale compared to other less rural areas.

I was pleased to attend Foxholes and Butterwick Parish Council meeting in September and I hope to attend the other Parish Councils in my wards in the near future. 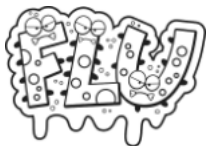
Community Cinema

Weaverthorpe Street Lighting

At the meeting of Weaverthorpe Parish Council held on 16th September 2019, the members agreed that as the money is now available to replace the street lighting with LEDs, that the work should now proceed.

The PC will be liaising with our contractor to have the work carried as soon as they are able to do so and will keep the residents informed via the Warbler.

The replacement will give us more sustainable street lighting, using LEDs which are not only longer life but also energy efficient. As part of the upgrade timers are being installed which will turn off the lights at midnight, then back on at 5am and off at dawn, to further increase our energy savings.

Weaverthorpe Community Speedwatch

The Community Speedwatch team continues to
monitor the speed of vehicles through our
village to help keep our village safer for all
residents. We have been operating now for
three years. As we have reported to residents
the scheme has helped to reduce speeds
through the village, but disappointingly over
recent months we have seen an increase in
the percentage of drivers ignoring the speed
limit. Analysis of the deployments over the
months of July and August show an average of
14% of drivers over the limit, too many of
those travelling at speeds well in excess of 40
mph.

We have recently had two of our team move on
due other commitments and would like to
welcome new volunteers to the team. If you
share the view that traffic is travelling too fast
through our village and would like to give 2 to
3 hours per month to help to get the message
to drivers to slow down, we would welcome
