

At the meeting of Weaverthorpe Parish Council held on 16th September 2019, the members agreed that as the money is now available to replace the street lighting with LEDs, that the work should now proceed.

The PC will be liaising with our contractor to have the work carried as soon as they are able to do so and will keep the residents informed via the Warbler.

The replacement will give us more sustainable street lighting, using LEDs which are not only longer life but also energy efficient. #### We averthorpe Community Speedwatch

The Community Speedwatch team continues to monitor the speed of vehicles through our village to help keep our village safer for all residents. We have been operating now for three years. As we have reported to residents the scheme has helped to reduce speeds through the village, but disappointingly over recent months we have seen an increase in the percentage of drivers ignoring the speed limit. Analysis of the deployments over the months of July and August show an average of 14% of drivers over the limit, too many of those travelling at speeds well in excess of 40 mph.

We have recently had two of our team move on due other commitments and would like to welcome new volunteers to the team. If you share the view that traffic is travelling too fast through our village and would like to give 2 to 3 hours per month to help to get the message to drivers to slow down, we would welcome your valuable time.
