FREE SOLAR PANELS FOR RYEDALE RESIDENTS



Ryedale District Council and Yorkshire Energy Partnership have teamed up to offer free solar panels to Ryedale residents. The scheme, which is the first of its kind in the area is funded by a private investor who re-coup their investment through the Government backed Feed-in-Tariff scheme. Residents will then benefit from the **free electricity** from the solar panels.

Solar photovoltaic panels use daylight to generate electricity for your home and can reduce your electricity bills by £294 a year. If you have a south facing roof and own your own home then you may qualify for FREE Solar Panels.

Question **Answers to Council Quiz** number NYCC is responsible for School Transport - BUT, if your school is an Academy, this service may have been contracted out. 2 NYCC are responsible for our 9,000Km road network - BUT if you live at the side of the A64 which is a trunk road, the responsibility lies with Highways England. Collection of refuse is the responsibility of RDC - BUT it is the responsibility of NYCC to dis-3 pose of waste.
