A View from County Hall



The Superfast North Yorkshire (SFNY) project has been a success story for some Wolds communities and a sorry subject for others. The most frustrating aspect seems to be not knowing if you will be in the next area to be covered. Phase 2 of the project will be completed by next June and last month we reaffirmed our commitment to delivering superfast broadband by agreeing a further funding of £20.5 million for phase three which will take that coverage up to about 95-96 per cent by 2019. We have begun a new procurement exercise and once completed, we hope to have a clearer picture of which communities will be included in phase

three.

At the end of July, I met with the Environment Agency and Kevin Hollinrake to discuss flood prevention. Many of the small villages I represent have either a stream or the Gipsy Race running through them and my concern has been that we do not seem to be getting the maintenance levels of the water courses needed to prevent flooding should we get heavy rainfall. Various solutions were discussed including the possibility of using the Internal Drainage Boards and better joined up working between the EA and Parish Councils.

A group to address flooding issues has been set up through joint working with the Parish Council in Thomton Dale and if any Wolds villages would like to copy this model, I would be very happy to help them do so.

The Gypsy Race

In the event of flooding in the wolds valley, the Gypsy Race will not act as a flood drain. Most people are aware that water finds its own level; even the Romans had a water level for construction purposes. If the water Table in the valley rises above the level of the bottom of the Gypsy race it will flow, if the Water Table rises above the level of the banks of the Gypsey Race it won't act as a drain and flooding will occur in some form. The Gypsey Race will benefit from clearing vegetation once per year and leaving the vegetation to flourish during the dry summer months of the year allows the plant life to regenerate and then the dying waste is cleared for the winter months. Having lived here for 70 years and spoken to and worked for people who have lived, farmed and worked this valley for three or more family generations no one has ever had any problems with the Gypsey Race. If new comers to the valley from District Councillors/Parish Councillors down to residents of twenty years or less think that in the event of major flooding in the valley the Gypsey Race will act as a Drain they need to get there heads out of the Clouds and come back to terra firma. The Gypsey Race is a chalk stream; no more no less and has flowed and dried up on its own since the Doomsday era. One of the best indications of rising water table is the Cellar floods at the Star Inn Weaverthorpe. Chris Howe.
