
There shall be a virtual annual general meeting of the Village Hall on Wednesday 17th February 2021.

Not a new topic but unfortunately one which periodically crops up and which is a regular feature on Parish Council agendas. Of course, the vast majority of dog owners are

responsible, always pick up the poo and keep their dogs on leads along roads and residential areas. Sadly however, a minority do not.

If owners insist on walking dogs without leads, please at least have the decency to keep your dogs under control and keep an eye on them and bag and bin any mess. The fact that a dog might also leave poo outside the residential areas, on or beside footpaths, is no reason to ignore it, many people enjoy their walks with their children especially in these 'isolated' times, so wherever it is left, it is unpleasant, unfair, and inconsiderate to other residents.

I am aware of several people, including myself, who have actually found dog poo left in our gardens and on a few occasions I have actually had to pick it up and dispose of it from my wife's and other late residents graves in the churchyard!

As a PC we will again be undertaking several measures over the coming months, to monitor and remind those few owners who treat our environment and indeed other residents, with such disregard and then take appropriate action. including reporting to the appropriate authorities. We understand that people are reluctant to report or act on particular problems or individuals, but we can only take specific action if it is reported and some irresponsible owners take advantage of that silence. We have NO qualms about reporting incidences or those offending because ultimately it is to the advantage of the majority who behave responsibly and care about our environment. If, however, anyone prefers to report incidents privately, please feel free to 'private message' me and I will guarantee 100% confidentiality, but at least we can then collate and monitor such reports and take action.

| am writing to introduce myself as the Youth Development Worker for North Yorkshire Youth (NYY) covering Scarborough and Ryedale. NYY are funded by North Yorkshire County Council to support voluntary youth work in North Yorkshire's communities. As part of our role, we help set up and sustain voluntary youth projects and | am

currently looking to find out a bit more about the Weaverthorpe area and the services that are available to young people.

We can offer to host consultation with young people to find out what is important to them locally, this can be done online or when possible in school and community settings. There are a range of possible projects that might appeal to young people, such as: Youth Clubs, Youth Café's (informal drop in with café style refreshments), Youth Councils, specific interest groups, film nights, and creating more facilities for young people in the area.

We can recruit and train volunteers and provide support with accessing funding, finding activities and resources and ongoing development. We can support existing voluntary youth groups and look to develop new ones, setting up a new youth group will be dependent on what is already available in the area and sufficient volunteers and young people coming forward to support a club and on finding a suitable venue, all of which we can support with.

During the current restrictions due to Covid-19 we, like many other organisations have had to look at working differently to continue to support young people. We have been offering support to volunteer led groups to deliver online sessions, and have being sending out weekly activities and information around key awareness days, such as anti-bullying week. We are also looking at community projects young people can get involved with.
