This month we are expecting the long awaited decision on Local Government Reform (LGR) and it's been a very busy time preparing for it. As the executive member for children's services, I work with a range of very successful services from Fostering and Adoption to Disabled

Children's Services and Youth Justice delivered across the whole of the North Yorkshire footprint. Children's services like those in

other directorates are tailored to fit local need because we know that one size doesn't fit all. It's always difficult trying to explain which authority is responsible for which service and residents can get very frustrated being passed from one

council to another. Sometimes the issue involves both councils and this can involve two sets of decision makers and two sets of strategies. I very much hope LGR enables us to continue delivering these outstanding services and that we are given the opportunity now to work more efficiently giving you the public more accountability and transparency.

Of course business still carries on as usual and we have some interesting new developments and pilot schemes. Our Highways operational service has now been brought back in house. The new company which was launched in June will take on responsibility for the services currently delivered by Ringway. We have recognised the issues around rural public transport and are running a "Dial a bus" pilot scheme in the west of the county which if successful will be rolled out throughout the county. We have submitted 28 innovative projects to government bidding for a £8.46 share of the £220m government funding earmarked to allow organisations to invest in their area. Around £4 million will be spent in the Ryedale and Scarborough area. All this and last week we got the call from OFSTED!

It is very dear that Post Covid we have all moved into a rapidly changing brave new world. I remain confident that new local government reform will give us the powers to successfully adapt to it.


