It has been a busy few months at Ryedale District Council. my new role as Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee has taken more of my time and we as a committee have been deciding what areas to focus on the next year.

We have taken the decision to review three main areas, Affordable Housing, the Staff Appraisal system and to review the new Enforcement Officers role and whether any improvements can be made.

The decision on the Local Government reorganisation has been received and whilst very disappointed, I along with other Councillors will do our best to

work together with North Yorkshire County Council to do the best for our residents moving forwards.

My main concerns with the reorganisation is to try and ring fence the reserves that have built up for use by the residents of Ryedale and not allow them to be swallowed up by the new, rather large Council, whether this is achievable is not known.

As a member of the Cattle Market working party I have a lot of residents that may be affected by any

decision and have a viewpoint on the way forward. I would appreciate receiving your views on this matter so that these can be taken into consideration when any decisions are made.

Unfortunately, the Chair of the working party Councillor John Clarke

sadly passed away recently, he will be a great loss to the Community, the Council and I shall miss his support and advice. I hope that we can still work together to bring forward the Cattle market project.

### **Brunch Club**

Augusts' Brunch Club took place on Friday 20th where we introduced a new start time, for the first sitting, commencing at 09 30hrs

The reason for this is that Norma (our very competent chef) very kindly, every month, drives in from Scarborough to manage the cooking side of things. Norma usually arrives at the Village Hall (VH) some time between 07.00 and 07.30hrs in order to do as much 'prep' as possible before the first sitting.

Now, although many of you may not think it, but Norma is not getting any younger (fact) and, as we approach autumn and winter, it seemed sensible to review our systems to make life easier for all.

And this is what we came up with:

- 1. Put back the start of the first sitting to 09.30hrs that means Norma can have an extra half hour in bed;
- 2. Review the 'Cooking' staff' arrangements such that there is not as much onus on Norma. We have done this by introducing more 'Cooks' in to the 'Team' i.e. Tricia Milner, Gill Trowsdale and Sue Pearce as a 'stand in' as and when required;

With all this change how does this affect you - our guests? Well, apart from a slightly later start time, for the first sitting, not at all. 'Front of house' will see all the usual helpers - Mary McKinley, Liz Mills, John Rummel, Sue Pearce and myself - and hopefully, in the not too distant future, Trevor Thomson. At 'rear of house', at any one time, there will be at least two 'Cooks' plus Anne Downes - Anne seeing to the washing up (as and when it arrives). I must not forget Stephen Milner who, at the end of 'service' (together with Tricia - up until the new regime) has stepped up to complete

the washing up for us.

The reason I am telling you all this is that Brunch Club is the mainstay income for the VH. But, more importantly, we consider that it is 'your' Brunch Club and we want you to feel very much a part of it, and to know and understand how it works.

By introducing small changes as we go along, we hope that we can continue for many years to come.

So, finally, thank you all for your support thus far!

### Towards a UNESCO Global Status Geopark for East Yorkshire PRESS RELEASE

For a number of years now a small group has been investigating the possibilities of an application to UNESCO for global geopark status for East Yorkshire, with support from a growing number of individuals, local, regional and national agencies, universities and other bodies.

Global Geoparks are given to areas of outstanding and unique geology and landscape in recognition of their wealth of historical heritage, tourism, and investment into local economies and people.

The proposed Geopark (see map) would run along the River Derwent in the West and North to Filey Brigg, along the coast in the East to Spurn Point and then along the Humber and Ouse in the South. This would encompass the Vales of York and Pickering, the Yorkshire Wolds and Holderness.

It is recognised that there is much talk about AONB status for the Yorkshire Wolds which our project supports for where the former is a legislative designation with a legal framework of planning and conservation, a Geopark is an international designation of an area. There is no conflict of interest between the two proposals.


