The Local Government Reorganisation is well on its way now and both Officers, staff and Councillors have been busy working together to achieve the best possible outcomes for Ryedale when the District Council ceases to exist in 2023. We hope to leave the area in a good, strong position and I for one am in support of using monies available to complete projects in the area to benefit the residents.



Whilst I do not intend to continue in Local Government after the reorganisation, I feel it is important for women to become more involved to ensure fair representation moving forward. Following the 2019 council elections, just 35% of councillors are female.

Local government significantly impacts vital services, from education and adult social care, to housing and jobs and local government spending actually accounts for almost a quarter of the UK's total – but how and where much of this money is spent is being decided in councils where an average 7 in 10 of councillors are male.

Recent events and my own experiences whilst serving on the council have shown that there are ongoing issues and to achieve any improvements we must acknowledge and address matters that some may find uncomfortable. This is fundamental to making it easier for women to become councillors but also create a culture where they wish to stay. I am happy to offer any encouragement, support or advice to those who interested in becoming involved.

Unfortunately Covid is still highly prevalent in the area with cases rising daily, please continue to protect yourselves and others by adhering to any guidelines provided and above all, respect others.

Private George Crozier, 1st Battalion, the Green Howards

Remembering the Fallen: on this day in 1971, Private George Crozier, 1st Battalion, the Green Howards, was killed in Northern Ireland. He was in the Ardoyne area of Belfast, at an observation post in the Flax Street mill, when he was fired up on by a sniper. He was taken to the Mater Infirmorum Hospital on the Crumlin Road, but had passed away before he arrived.

Private Crozier had joined the army in 1965 after having been employed on a farm. He is buried in the graveyard of the parish church of St. Mary, Sledmere, in East Yorkshire. The Daily Express journalist, Pau Dacre, wrote on seeing a photograph of Private Crozier: "It was a haunting face. Young enough to be hopeful. Old enough to know better. A soft face hardened by reality."

George, from Cowlam, near Driffield in East Yorkshire, was 23 years old.


