

A View from County Hall



Last week we unanimously supported a revised 20mph speed limit policy which places greater focus on active, sustainable travel, such as cycling and walking, and encouraging a sense of place. The revised policy follows a review and recommendations by the council's

Transport, Economy and Environment Scrutiny Committee. It continues to support 20mph limits and zones where

appropriate, taking a targeted, evidence-based approach, while broadening its scope to recognise the importance of community and social interaction.

We listened to active campaigners seeking a default 20mph speed limit in all built-up areas of the county but thought a more locality-based approach was better. Saving people's lives and making our roads as safe as possible is of the very highest priority. Whilst every casualty is one too many, I am pleased to report that accidents on our county roads are on a strong downward trajectory. The areas where we have road safety challenges include motorcyclists, newly qualified drivers, older drivers and drunk or drugged drivers. Accidents in built up areas are relatively low and a blanket approach to the introduction of a 20mph would divert resources away from dealing with evidenced key safety issues. A blanket approach would also require engineering methods such as speed bumps to self-enforce the limit and these often come with their own set of problems.

The newly adopted policy sets out a more tailored rationale and assessment process and includes the opportunity for greater focus on the sense of place and community, particularly around schools. The policy assures us that where there is a history of speed-related collisions that would benefit from a reduced limit, including 20mph, such measures would be taken forward.

Car Scheme - Volunteer Drivers

We are a charity that was established in 2005 to coordinate volunteers who were willing to give some of their time and use their personal cars to transport people in Ryedale from their homes to medical appointments or local towns for shopping or other appointments. We have grown since those times and today have over 1100 members registered on our Car Scheme.

Our volunteer drivers have been the backbone of this growth. Today, in 2022, those needing help have increased but the number of volunteer drivers have dwindled often due to their increasing age. *We desperately need more people* to step forward and help. This might be you.

There is no "ideal " volunteer - young or old, retired or working, male or female just somebody who has access to a reliable car, has spare time on a regular or occasional basis and wants to help their fellow citizens in their village, local area or in Ryedale.

Our members are charged 45p per mile for their journey. This money is given directly to the volunteer driver and covers their mileage from their home to collect the member, take them to their appointment, wait up to two hours for the appointment to end, drive the member home and finally returning to their home. The charity receives none of the money.

It is obvious that having a volunteer driver living nearer to a member reduces the number of "dead miles" (when the member is not in the vehicle) so the travel cost reduces, often helping those on low income.

The money the driver receives is non-taxable and is for the running cost of the

journey. The volunteer's contribution to the charity is their time.....

If you feel able to volunteer you will need to have a fully roadworthy vehicle capable of taking a passenger who is maybe frail, elderly or have limited mobility.

We will arrange for you to have a DBS check with NYCC in order for you to obtain your volunteer identity card. If you feel you would like to help, or want further information, please call
