A View from County Hall



Whatever you voted at the recent NYCC elections, I would like to thank all of you for turning out to vote and for returning me to represent "Thornton Dale and The Wolds" division. I feel privileged to represent you for the last and final year of the outgoing North Yorkshire County Council and for the first four years of the new unitary North Yorkshire

Council. I will continue to work hard to ensure our villages have strong representation and that we make a seamless transition through this challenging time.

I was returned with a strong majority however for some candidates across the county, the count was nail bitingly close! One Ryedale candidate being elected by a majority of only 7 votes after three recounts and in the west of the county three candidates in a division returned 501, 503 and 503 votes, the elected councillor being returned on the casting of straws.

47 conservative members make up the leading group of the new council with a coalition of 13 Liberal and Liberal Democrat members making up the opposition and 12 candidates within the Labour group. The position of the "Independent" councillors is always an interesting one, unless an Independent member "groups" they are left without access to the major positions on the council. Eight of the Independent councillors have formed a "group" (which I find something of an oxymoron), whilst five of the Independents have remained truly "Independent". I will be continuing as one of the ten executive members retaining my current portfolio of Children's Services. The Children and Young Peoples Directorate is already delivering OFSTED rated "Outstanding" services across the county footprint, so we are not expecting significant changes to this service as we move into unitary local government.

The government has asked us to move to a unitary authority as a requirement for a devolution deal for York and North Yorkshire which is part of their "levelling up" agenda. If successful, a devolution deal will hand over decision-making powers along with tens of millions of pounds in funding to political leaders in York and North Yorkshire. The Government are expected to make an announcement on an offer for devolution this summer before public consultations are staged later in the year.

Apologies if these results seem less exciting that the Rangers football results but the NYCC results will shape our services over the next five years.
