

View from County Hall



There are two major concerns we have been directing our recourses to over the summer, firstly the surge in the covid virus and secondly preparing to submit a unitary bid when we receive the expected invitation from government which we believe to be imminent.

North Yorkshire is surrounded by other local authorities all experiencing high numbers of Covid cases. Though our numbers are still relatively low we are seeing a rapid increase with three hot spots within our county. Thankfully

Ryedale is not one of them and if we don't relax these newly acquired habits of increased hand washing and social distancing, we have a good chance of containing the virus in our area.

Preparations for unitary local government are moving at pace and we are looking to submit an innovative bid which will cut duplication whilst enabling us to continue to deliver outstanding services with least disruption. NYCC already successfully deliver 80% of services across the North Yorkshire footprint, put simply, for every £5 spent on council services in North Yorkshire £4 is delivered by NYCC. A bid to deliver that extra 20% within the same area picking up and retaining the best practice of districts is a strong option. Within this proposed single unitary, additional powers would be handed down and focused locally around our market towns retaining our community voice and strengthening accountability to you. There are ideas around

forming two new councils within North Yorkshire by either a North/South or East/West split, this would necessitate two sets of top tier management reducing possible savings along with disruption to our front line services. City of York have made it quite clear that they do not want to be included in a unitary with our area but are happy to join with North Yorkshire for the bigger prize of Devolution.

The final decision on unitary will be made by government who will carefully examine, compare and scrutinise any bids put forward to ensure they are capable of making the savings we need to recover from the cost of the pandemic whilst retaining and improving services to yourselves. 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Sherburn and Rillington Flu Clinics

Managing the flu season alongside Covid-19 will be a particular challenge for GP practices. This year to maintain the safety of our staff and patients we are running appointment times only, there will be no drop-in sessions. Patients will need to contact the Practice to book an appointment or alternatively book an appointment online. We are opting to use village halls instead of the surgery so please can you wear facemasks and clothing which can be easily removed or a short sleeved top so the clinician can easily access your armto administer your flu jab. Things will look a little different to usual but staff will be on hand to explain any one-way systems or other safety measures. To help reduce queues, please attend as close to your appointment time as possible. You can also help your practice to stay safe by following social distancing measures and following the instructions of practice staff. If you feel unwell with Covid-like symptoms, book a Covid test and do not attend for your flu jab until it is safe to do so.

Weaverthorpe Village Hall



Brunch Club Re-Opening Yes, we will be re-starting Brunch Club on Friday 16th October after being closed for 6 months.

(We can comply with the current guidelines but should any changes be made in the law).

This is how it will work.

The maximum numbers of people permitted to be seated for eating at any one time will be 20. This is clearly the first indicator that things will be different!

The next big change will be that there will be two sittings. The 1st sitting will be between 09.15 and 10.30hrs, and the 2nd sitting between 10.45 and 12.00hrs. For each of the sittings our guests must vacate the hall by, or immediately at the end of, the sitting they are attending.

The reasons for this are that we will need sufficient time at the end of the 1s sitting in order to clean and lay the tables ready for the 2^{nd} sitting. And, at the end of the 2^{nd} sitting, so that the 'helping staff' might again clear everything away prior to their having their own brunch.

It will be necessary to make a reservation for either the 1st or 2nd sitting. This must be done before 20.00hrs on Wednesday 14th October. Reservations can only be made by contacting Trevor Thomson on 07972132158. You will be required to give your name and contact details and inform Trevor of the number of places you would like – with a maximum of 6 places. If you would like to reserve more than 2 places then you must confirm that the other people with whom you will be sharing a table are already part of a 'bubble' which you are currently part of.

Guests will not be permitted in to the hall until the appointed time of the start of each sitting.

Within the hall there will be ten tables of two placed two metres apart. Your name will be placed on your table. If you have reserved as part of a larger 'bubble' the tables will be put together for the size of your 'bubble' (with a maximum of 6 people).

At no time will anyone other than the 'helping staff' be permitted either in to the kitchen foyer or kitchen area.

The menu choices will be as previously available. For both your safety and peace of mind, and also that of the 'helpers', we have worked hard at putting together a plan as to how the 'service' will be organised - you will see the evidence of this once you are seated. But, be assured that everything that can be done has been taken in to consideration i.e. everything that will be used during the 1st sitting will either not be re-used for the 2^{nd} sitting or completely sanitised - to the extent that chairs used during the 1st sitting will not be used again that day.

For you to be part of the New Brunch Club this is what you will need to do:

- Decide which sitting you would like to attend.
 - Call Trevor to make the reservation for your choice of sitting. Trevor will advise as to whether places are available for your choice of sitting and numbers of places you would like.
- Arrive on time for the start of the sitting you have chosen.
- Please vacate your table as soon as possible once you have finished your meal or certainly by the end of your sitting.

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
