It has often been the case that the creation of large unitary councils often exceed their expected budgets and do not improve the services offered on a local basis. My belief is that a smaller council with elected Councillors, who know their area is not only better for the residents but more democratic.

Finally, after much consideration I have resigned from the Conservative Party, it was a difficult decision to make but I believe that I will be able to stand up for what is best for The Wolds as an Independent Councillor moving forward.

Governor Vacancy

The Wolds and Valle governing body are looking to recruit a governor to the board, this is a Co-opted skills based position and anyone can apply.

Why volunteer to be a school governor?

School governors make a valuable contribution to children's education, opportunities and futures. Being a school governor is a challenging but hugely rewarding role. It will give you the chance to make a real difference to young people, give something back to your local community and use and develop your skills in a board-level environment. Schools need governing boards that have a balance and diversity of knowledge, skills and experience to enable it to be effective.

Who can become a school governor or trustee?

Anyone aged 18 or over can be a governor or trustee (but there are some exceptions) and you do not need to be a parent. There is no requirement for you to have an understanding of the education system, just the necessary skills, character and time to contribute. There is plenty of training available to help you learn about education. Schools need and benefit from a range of professional knowledge on their governing board including education, finance, human resources, legal, marketing and public relations, property and estates management, and organisational change.
