A View from County Hall



The devastating situation unfolding in Ukraine is brought into stark reality when you hear news of the first local family taking a mother and young child into their household. As executive member for Children's Services I have been closely involved in overseeing families that are going through temporary problems, the placement of our children coming into care and the placement of Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children. The plight of the evacuees from Ukraine has touched a raw emotional nerve in us all. In practical terms, we are now working on how we can wrap services around these traumatised families and welcome them sensitively into our communities. This won't be an easy task, but I am confident that we will develop a flexible and compassionate strategy for dealing at all levels with the abhorrent consequences of the war in Ukraine. As we move from pandemic to endemic and wrestle with economic recovery, I am humbled by the generosity of our own struggling families who have offered to open their doors when we are all facing the prospect of a tightening budget.

This will be my last message to you before my third term of office ends and we move into the election period for a new unitary council, so forgive me for being a little reflective. Local Government moves very slowly, and this is for good reason, it's a big machine, has many internal cogs and the possible unintended consequences of the decision making process can be the most damaging to the most vulnerable in our society so we are ever mindful of unintended consequences. When I look back on the first big hurdle I faced back in 2011 it was the almost impossible task of bringing fast speed broadband to the wolds. As with any job, there are quick fixes, long slow burns and admittedly some failures. I have been very grateful for your support and I have always done my very best to represent your views from street level to the very top. It has been both an honour and a privilege to serve you and I would like to thank you all for working actively with me.

I am a great believer in the democratic process, and so I now stand at that crossroad with my future in your hands when I stand for re-election on May 5th.

We had a very good turnout of people, for our last meeting on Monday 7th March. We were treated to a very entertaining and colourful, fact filled evening, by Paul Hildreth BSc., on the Foundations of Sherburn, through its geology going back millions of years!!

We travelled through times of heat and cold, wet and dry, met dinosaurs plus sea reptiles...Absolutely fascinating..

An illustrated talk looked at the underlying layers of rocks and structures of the Sherburn and surrounding area. Paul explained how they have influenced the local landscape, settlement and human activities. Geological specimens were available for us to look at, touch and discuss...amazing!

Paul is certainly an expert in his field.....A former teacher and oilfield geologist, Paul has been a member of the council of the Yorkshire Geological Society since 2007. He served as its General Secretary from 2011-2018 and was then elected President for 2019-2020. He was awarded the Halstead Medal for 2021 by the Geologists' Association, London, in recognition of his services to geology

Paul was pleased to be back in his native area...brought up in Norton and a former pupil at Malton Grammar School. During the evening, he sparked the interest of the audience, some of whom will go in search of their own fossils, dinosaur footprints or red chalk, but we will all certainly look at the our coastal outcrops of rocks with more understanding and awe.

Paul told us about his recently released four-part virtual geology field trip around Flamborough Head which is available on YouTube, and is accessible to all....have a look...just Google...

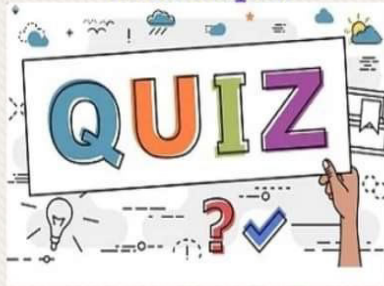

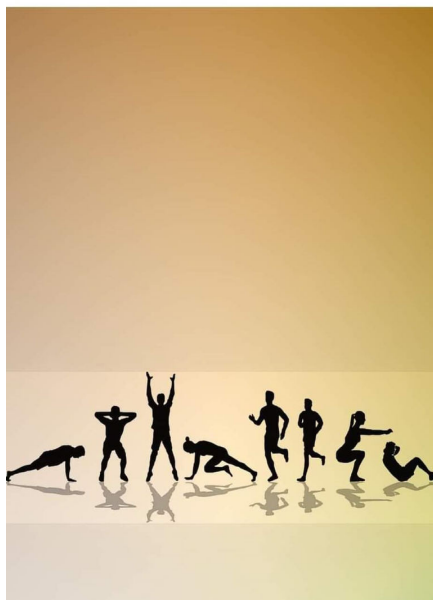
