Wolds Merlins Finish As Double Runners-Up

The Wolds Short Mat Bowls Team who are based at Ganton Village Hall are celebrating the end of the 2021/22 season with their team, The Merlins', winning both the Scarborough & District League Runners-up trophy and Challenge Cup Finalists medals.

Originally founded in time to play two teams in the 2019/20 season, the Merlins finished as Division Two Champions and were looking forward to playing in Division One in 20/21 Unfortunately, as with the rest of the country, they had their season cancelled due to the pandemic.

When play resumed last September, due to a lack of returning players, the League found themselves having to abolish Division Two, as several clubs in the League, including the Wolds had lost their second and third (in one case, fourth) team. Club Chair. Pete Arthur said 'The Merlins started the season with the intention of finishing in the top half of the league, so that if Division Two is resurrected next season, we'd stay in Division One. 



Sherburn Local History Society: Our Next Meeting

Big Date for your diaries: Monday 9th May 2022: 6.30 at Sherburn Village Hall.

We are very proud, delighted and excited to be welcoming the internationally known and award winning Professor Dominic Powlesland to offer us an illustrated talk about the archaeology of Sherburn and surrounding areas.

<u>In 2019 Professor Powlesland was awarded the British Academy Landscape Archaeology Medal</u> for his contribution to the subject, for pioneering methodologies for large scale excavation, Landscape Research and the application of computers in field archaeology.

Professor Dominic Powlesland is the Director of the Landscape Research Centre and has been actively researching the archaeology of the Vale of Pickering since his first visit to Cook's Quarry in West Heslerton in 1977.

His massive excavations covering nearly 30 hectares at Cook's Quarry, West Heslerton combined with more than 40 years of air photographic surveys from satellites, planes and drones, covering the southern side of the Vale of Pickering from the river Derwent to the northern edge of the Wolds from Rillington to Binnington, and more than 1500Ha of high resolution geophysical survey have combined to make **this area one of the most intensively studied archaeological landscape for its scale in the world.**

The latest of the current settlements in the research area, Sherburn, sits within a landscape of intensive activity from the mesolithic to modern times - covering over 10,000 years of completely unanticipated levels of human activity.

His research has revealed an extraordinary past revealing, for instance, the impacts of climate change and pandemics in the post Roman world but also the rapid loss of a unique archaeological resource through increasingly industrialised agriculture.

Expect to see awesome slides and information showing, for instance, what appears to be a Mid/Late Saxon tithe processing centre in Sherburn visible from the air and geophysical survey overlain on air photography visible in Google Earth.

This evening promises to be of great interest to local people wanting to know more about their history, as well as 'Time Team-type' addicts, other archaeologists, computer and air photographic enthusiasts, puzzlers/problem solvers or the simply curious. An opportunity not to be missed!!


