Well – wasn't the Jubilee Weekend a great success?

And wasn't the special edition 'Jubilee Warbler' a great summary of the event – well done Trevor!!

So what is happening at the Village Hall?

Well, by the time you read this we will have held two memorable events – the first being the 'Open Gardens' weekend (Sunday 26th June) and second, the 'Yorkshire Wolds Cycle Challenge (Sunday 3rd July)'.

Hopefully the weather will have been kind for both of these events and that the village can get behind them – visiting some of the superb hidden gem gardens within Weaverthorpe, and also giving support to the 200 or so cyclists taking part in the charity event.

For the VH the latter event will have been one of the biggest to have been staged in recent years. The logistics of providing food and drink for that many people has been somewhat of a headache (Sue Thomson heading up the research for the victuals we are to provide). But it will only be afterwards that we will know if we got it right fingers crossed as the event happens every year and we would like to be a part of it for years to come.

The saga of the porch extension is not yet resolved as we now have another proposal for the construction. Instead of building the framework in timber (which is currently very expensive), it has now been suggested that we might look at using a steel frame instead. More research required.

Within the hall itself we are to look at providing a number of electrical sockets within the storeroom. I know, we don't understand why there are not power outlets there either. Anyhow, once we have power in the storeroom, we will be asking our electrician to install a power supply into the shed - so that we can charge the battery for the strimmer.

In addition, we have, for some time now, struggled to manage with the fridge/freezer in the kitchen - not enough 'freezing' room! For that reason we have decided to purchase a chest freezer. It will go in the storeroom - but only after we have

'power'!

As a consequence of the fire to the outside wall at the western end of the hall, we have decided to install a CCTV system.

All positive so far!!

What else is happening?

Starting we think in August, and on the second Friday of each month, a drop in coffee morning at the VH from between 10.00 and 12.00hrs. Pop along, unwind, have a chat, and browse the hundreds of books we have available for purchase – only 50p per book. Coffee, Tea and biscuits available.

Saturday 27th August - Weaverthorpe and District Produce Show. More details to follow.

Saturday 10th September – an evening looking in depth at historical Weaverthorpe. A proposal to see again the pictures shown at the VH during the Jubilee weekend of Weaverthorpe in the past. But, on this occasion, to have time to really see the pictures and to hopefully have one or two people who can remember the events and describe what was going on. More details later on.

Friday 30th September – Pop-up Cinema Returns! Hurrah!! More details in this Warbler and to follow. I think that is about it for now.


