# View from County Hall



At our July full council meeting where decisions made by the executive were ratified, we also had two "notices on motion" brought to us to debate. Both items were on climate change, and both shared the request to create a new scrutiny committee to deal with the single issue of climate change.

Climate change across the county is of course extremely important, we have already seen the consequences of flooding, the recent hot weather

event and the horrific devastation of the fires both in open country and sadly now in communities across the region. The consideration of climate change is already a golden thread that runs through all our policies and decision making. We have always undertaken

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an Equalities Impact Assessment at the end of every report, every decision made, and policy made. During the last term of office, we made the decision that a Climate Change Impact Assessment should also sit alongside the EIA.

The notices on motion had the potential to have unintended consequences which we needed to understand clearly such as the impact on recourses, how it gels with everything else we are doing to address climate change and the possibility of it even diluting what we are already doing by moving it away from everything that we do to a single scrutiny committee. As a

consequence, we made the decision to bring the two notices to the executive for consideration so that the full implications could be tested. Policy decisions are often worse for being made on the hoof, better policies are delivered when full consideration is given to all eventualities and a slight delay would not affect the outcome if it meant getting it right first time.

As executive member for children's services, the best legacy we can leave our children is to ensure that the planet is protected. I will do all within my power to ensure the best policies are made to do this.

# IMPORTANT CHANGES TO OUR SHERBURN AND RILLINGTON DISPENSARY SERVICE

We have recently reviewed our dispensing processes; due to the current pressures our team are experiencing. To maintain a safe and efficient service for our patients we are making some slight changes.

From 1st August we are asking you to give us a minimum of 4 days from ordering your repeat medication to collecting them. This means if you order your medication for example on a Monday then we will expect you to collect on Thursday. Our dispensary team are not working on a weekend so please do not include a Saturdays or Sundays in those 4 waiting days. Whilst some dispensaries have ceased any telephone ordering, we feel due to the rurality of our practice population this is important to maintain. However, we will be reducing the telephone access for ordering prescriptions to between 10-12noon.

We have reinstated our outside post box at Sherburn meaning both practices can now receive your medication request slips when we are closed.

Both acute and repeat medications can easily be requested via the NHS app or via the online access via our website <a href="https://www.srpractice.co.uk">www.srpractice.co.uk</a> (new users will need to complete a simple registration form available from reception), this means you do not need to make contact with the practice until you come in to collect your medication.

If you feel these changes may cause you difficulties then please discuss these with Carol, our Dispensary Manager, or a member of her team and we will work together to resolve any concerns you may have.

Our 75th annual open show takes place on Sunday 7th August, due to the pandemic it is our first since 2019. Our show secretary and committee have worked hard to put on this special event and we are all looking forward to what we hope will be a bumper day for exhibitors and visitors. To that end there will be gifts for all children who exhibit, special prize cards and certificates and commemorative medals for our trophy winners. We do hope that we have categories to suit everyone who wishes to enter and these include, Flowers, Fruit and Vegetables, Cakes and Preserves, Crafts and Art and Photography. Its only 30p per entry, free for children and you could be a winner. Exhibits can be staged on Saturday 6th August between 6 pm and 8 pm and on the morning of the show between 8 am and 10 am when the exhibition rooms will close for judging. For those who wish to come along and enjoy the afternoon we will open to the public at 2.pm admission 50p for adults free for children. There will be refreshments and a raffle. Presentations to the winners will be from 4 pm. The show is held at the Community Centre, Stonegate, Hunmanby.

To commemorate this special event we have produced a 75th booklet giving a potted history of the association right back to its beginnings in February 1944. Adults and children have contributed memories of past shows and anecdotes from our records are included. Did you know that the very first trophy to be awarded was presented by Sir Billy Butlin in 1946 who offered the dining hall at his holiday camp in Filey to stage the show. The trophy is still competed for to this day and took me two hours to polish to be ready for presentation. The commemorative booklet will be available on the day free of charge so be sure to take one. See you all there.

#### REPLACEMENT BENCH FOR HELPERTHORPE

As part of its efforts to make improvements for the community and for visitors to the area, Luttons Parish Council has established a programme of community bench replacement, siting new benches along footpaths and cycling routes. The next bench to be replaced is the deteriorating wooden bench just to the west of Helperthorpe on the National Cycle Network Route 166, a Sustrans regional route in the Yorkshire Wolds. As with the Parish Council provided benches in West Lutton and East Lutton, the replacement Helperthorpe bench will be bought from British Recycled Plastic which is an independently-owned British business based in Yorkshire that manufactures maintenance free benches that are made from 100% recycled material and are fully recyclable. John Wane, Chair of Luttons Parish Council said: "I was delighted that we were able to engage with British Recycled Plastic to provide the benches for our Parish. Not only are the benches durable and will never rot or splinter, they offer a positive environmental contribution and are made in Yorkshire!"

The siting of the benches is aimed to encourage physical activity and to support mental well-being. The Helperthorpe bench will be the fifth Harewood style bench from British Recycled Plastic to be installed. Further benches will be replaced and installed as part of a rolling improvement programme by the Parish Council.

Martin Pearce, the Chair of the Parish Council Environmental Working Group, stated: "In selecting the location of each of our five benches we wanted to choose spots that would encourage members of the community to engage in physical activity safe in the knowledge that there would be somewhere comfortable to rest for a while and to take in some of the stunning views of our local area. Knowing that, once installed, the benches not only look attractive and also fit well with their surroundings, are maintenance free and are environmentally friendly, fulfilled all Parish Council key requirements given our strong focus on community, the environment and on sustainability".

The Helperthorpe bench has been ordered and will be installed as soon as it has been delivered.

### WEST LUTTON MAKERS AND BAKERS EVENT WITH A TWIST


After an absence of 2 years due to the Covid 19 pandemic, Saturday 23 July saw the return of the popular West Lutton Makers and Bakers Event. This year, however, also saw the introduction of an added dimension; a Village Scarecrow Festival.



Kind weather on the day and considerable pre-event promotion activity ensured that attendance from around the area was strong. Those who came enjoyed a wide range of stalls and demonstrations with people being able to interact with those displaying their crafts and

considerable skills. The amount of talent on show was phenomenal with displays including willow weaving, sketching and painting, felt picture making, pottery,

candles, sewing and crochet and woodwork in the form of bird and bug houses. The tombola and raffle stalls proved a popular draw while the



cakes and were supplemented by ice creams, teas, coffees and cold soft drinks. The Cake Stand provided another great opportunity for talent to be demonstrated and it rapidly sold out of its exceptionally enticing wares. Excellent musical entertainment was provided throughout the day by members of the growing West Lutton folk group.



The Scarecrow Festival caught the imagination of many in West Lutton and the range of Scarecrows on display was as imaginative as it was incredibly impressive. It was the first time seen in the village since 2010. Scarecrows ranged from singers, cyclists, surfers, tractor drivers, window cleaners, gardeners, head massagers, Victorian



bathers to cartoon and story-book characters and even insects. The Scarecrow Policeman with his Speed Camera ensured that traffic past the event kept to the speed limit and



that order was maintained. While most of the Scarecrows could be spoken about, there was 'one who could not be named'. Happily, Harry Potter was on hand to ensure that nothing untoward happened to the muggles of the village.

A huge thank you to all who supported the event. We raised over £1000 for the church, which was amazing! We still tried to ensure the event was accessible to all, with the delicious burgers and bacon butties at very reasonable prices-just £2.

As the church is currently our only village building for the community, it is great we can keep it going. So many churches around the country are having to close. So we're really pleased to keep St Mary's afloat. Without the wider support from the community this wouldn't be possible. We hope the church can continue to be used for the community. Do ask if you would like to use it.

The atmosphere of the event was very relaxed and there were great conversations going on, which was lovely to see. New people came and our trustee regulars were there too. Big thanks to all who came and supported the Makers and Bakers and who enjoyed the scarecrows.
