A View from County Hall



One of the great aspects of representing you, is being able to shift focus between very local events and broader county wide work and I hope to emphasise this contrast here. I would like to say a very big thank you to residents of Wintringham for their invitation to

view their bat conservation project at St Peter's Church. I confess, when I first heard about this, it brought back memories of the difficulties trying to manage the bats in St Hilda's Church in Ellerburn. I was keen to see how they had combined the welfare of the bats with the preservation of this beautiful Church. Needless to say, I was impressed. Highlights included displays and films of the bats, beautiful wooden carvings on the pews, fantastic art work of bats by local children and a trip up the church tower with spectacular views over the Wolds. I will certainly be making a return visit to see the real bats and not just the sporting residents who were dressed as bats!

Our Youth Justice Service at North Yorkshire County Council is something of a Cinderella service. The positive impacts of a good Youth Justice Service can really change the lives of young people and their families, so I would like to shine a light on what they do. Last month one of our officers received a commendation from the Chief Constable for her work. She clearly made a huge difference to the family she had been working with. The YJS is currently working on a "Test & Learn Pilot Programme" this builds on existing work to bring about a reduction in the number of First Time Entrants into the criminal justice system. The YJS team work with young people that with a little early help can be diverted from going the wrong way in life. The pilot also works positively to influence the trajectory of those young people at risk of re-entering the system.

This work has meant that in comparison to the previous year, the Youth Justice Service has been instrumental in preventing 50 fewer young people entering the criminal justice system for the first time, a 28% drop in the rate of reoffending and no custodial sentences. I think we can all look back in life and remember someone who gave us the confidence to move our lives in a better direction. The YJS does this daily and though their work largely goes under the radar, their influence is significant to the lives they change.

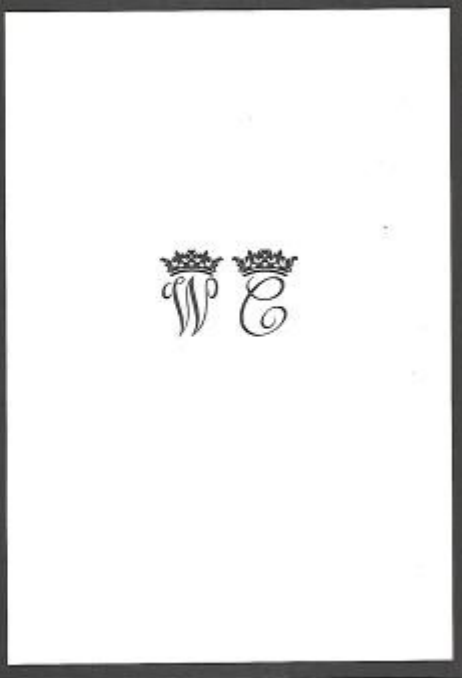

Helperthorpe Bird Notes



An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.

Highlight of Jan ... early Feb ... was a short-eared owl loping along a tree line ... had to be reminded to stop whooping and clapping as was standing in Octon Crematorium car park ... only ten seconds worth though an amazing sight ... see these birds very rarely ... most pictures capture the owls facial disk with those penetrating eyes ... they are ground nesting birds and during the breeding season the male has a display flight clapping his wings under the body ...and something different ... when out sound recording last summer would often hear the raucous calls of peacocks ... from a generally westerly direction ... so on a trip to Sherburn one stepped across the road ... did do a double take ... and had taken my medication for the day ...the other Saturday it must have been national barn owl day ... on the way out one was down Croome Lane ... on the way back singletons at Haverdale ... and Summit Farm ... so lucky to live in an area where there is always chance of one crossing your path ...birds during the month ... fieldfare 50 ... pink-footed geese 50 ... tree creeper ... barn owl ... goldcrest ... greenfinch ... four buzzards in a stack over Sledmere ... two red kites on a back road to Norton ... at least four song thrushes in the village belting out their strident double phrases ...if you keep bird records ... might be worth downloading them onto the BTO Birdtrack site ... it is free ... and there is an app ... it was initially used to track bird migration ... now it is so much more ...as mentioned previously am listed as more than inept at nest finding... so finding a long-tailed nest although it was last years was



something of a happy smiley face moment ... the nest is made from interwoven spiders webs and lichen ... lined with feathers ... as the family expands so does the nest ... the adults are often supported by

siblings and other birds that may have lost their nest ... as a result fledging rates are good ...

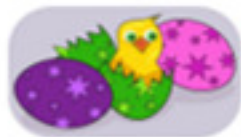
