across North Yorkshire which will be based around market towns. This is proving to be a difficult task because, we are such a large and diverse geographical area that it is clear a "one size fits all" approach would not work. My concern is that the area I represent is made up of a collection of small villages, and the market towns are not always relevant to these communities meaning that there was a danger of the rural areas being left out. A decision has been made to pilot five new "Partnerships" which would be pathfinders for the others. I am delighted to say that part of the area I represent has been chosen for one of the pilot schemes.

After first being elected in 2011, I worked closely with communities and representatives to bringing fast speed broadband to the Wolds. We regularly drew NYCC officers and interested parties together with the then Ryedale District councillor, Parish Councils and of course myself. This brought in a wealth of invaluable local knowledge, but the group disbanded after we achieved a high level of broadband cover across the Wolds. As the group had been so successful, I lifted and shifted the idea to the other side of the valley and this group has now been established for well over a decade. It is this group that will expand to form one of the five pilot projects in the "Forest and Dale Partnership". This group of Parish Councils already works with community officers, NY Police, Forestry England and a host of others in an informal way, so we would work to expand this and formalise it. There would later be the potential to mirror this group back across the other side of the valley to the Wolds where the idea first started. Of course, this would be with the proviso that it is what Wolds communities wanted. If there are opportunities to be had post unitary, then we should grasp them.

Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



Serendipity plays a part in all our lives ... heads or tails ... butterside down on a falling piece of toast ... went out sound recording with lesser whitethroat in mind ... spent two hours with a sedge warbler instead ... they are not rare birds just that one parked in a hedgerow was not in its required habitat ... which water courses ... rough pasture and reed beds are ... it is an lbj ... little brown job ... with an eye stripe ... it positively glowed when caught by the early morning sun ... this is a true migrant journeying from south of the Sahara ... its binomial is acrocephalus schoenobaenus ... greek acros + cephale = pointed head ... greek schoiniclos + baino = reed + to walk ... the last part it did numerous times scaling up and down old weed stems ... its song is described as suddenly picking up speed and inspiration then bursting into an impressive flourish ... thanks to the Handbook of Western Paleartic birds ... bit like kick starting an engine ... it won't ... repeat x3 ... then it does ... next day and it was gone ...



Had a good few weeks sound recording in close proximity to chiffchaff ... willow warbler ... and crows nests ... Bowls as had plenty of interest when looking skywards ... two red kite ... two buzzards ... two curlew shared the same air space at any one time accompanied by the occasional irate crow ... Red kites seem to be being added to daily lists ... highlight was



three in a stack over the house ... another two migrants to mention ... quail have been singing ... if that is what it is ... since mid May ... diminutive birds with a far reaching call ... with a 'wet my lips' rhythm ... and a hobby scattered the house martins recently ... the final addition to the list is marsh harrier ... one or two turn up during the later summer months ... this one is rather early ... know they breed at Blacktoft Sands ... not too sure if any are closer ..? over the years they have changed their breeding habitat ... some have been noted using cereal crop fields as well as their usual preference reed beds ... haven't seen too many butterflies ... so a pair of speckled woods spiralling around one another was an enjoyable moment ... some projects have been completed ... the BTO breeding bird survey has been completed ... and the

first rising skylark to be recorded was springboarding upwards at 03:05 last Saturday David Mellor
