



A View from County Hall



Autumn is always the time we begin the process of setting the budget for 2024/25. We are all mindful that amidst the current financial climate, many people are struggling to make ends meet. This situation is not limited to residents and

families, Birmingham City Council, the largest local authority in the country became the latest local authority to issue a section 114 notice, in effect declaring itself to be bankrupt. Nearer to home we hear that Kirklees is amongst the other local authorities in financial distress and we know that others will be considering s114 notice. Although the new North Yorkshire Council are struggling to plug a £30m gap, we are in a better position, firstly because we have always been financially prudent, but also because of the move to a unitary council.

The outgoing district and borough councils were responsible for about 10,650 footway lighting columns. It is estimated that 5,000 of these have non-LED lanterns. In recent years, North Yorkshire County Council replaced about 95 per cent of its streetlights with energy efficient LED technology. The completion of this project has seen almost a 50 per cent reduction in energy and a decrease in maintenance costs. We are now to be asked to approve the replacement of all concrete columns, obsolete brackets and non-LED lanterns over a three-year period. The project aims to mitigate against the risk of increasing energy costs and contribute towards the county's carbon reduction targets. The cost of replacing the lanterns as well as necessary brackets and columns is £2.49 million. The anticipated savings are £440,000 with a payback period of about five-and-a-half years. Sometimes it pays to spend a little to save!

Another innovative idea has come through our bereavement services who have raised funds through the recycling of metals recovered from cremations with consent from the bereaved families. The funds will be distributed as two rounds of grants funding totalling £87,000 to award. Last year, Woodlands Crematorium donated about £4,750 to Saint Catherine's Hospice, and £19,000 to The Rainbow Centre which supports vulnerable people in crisis.

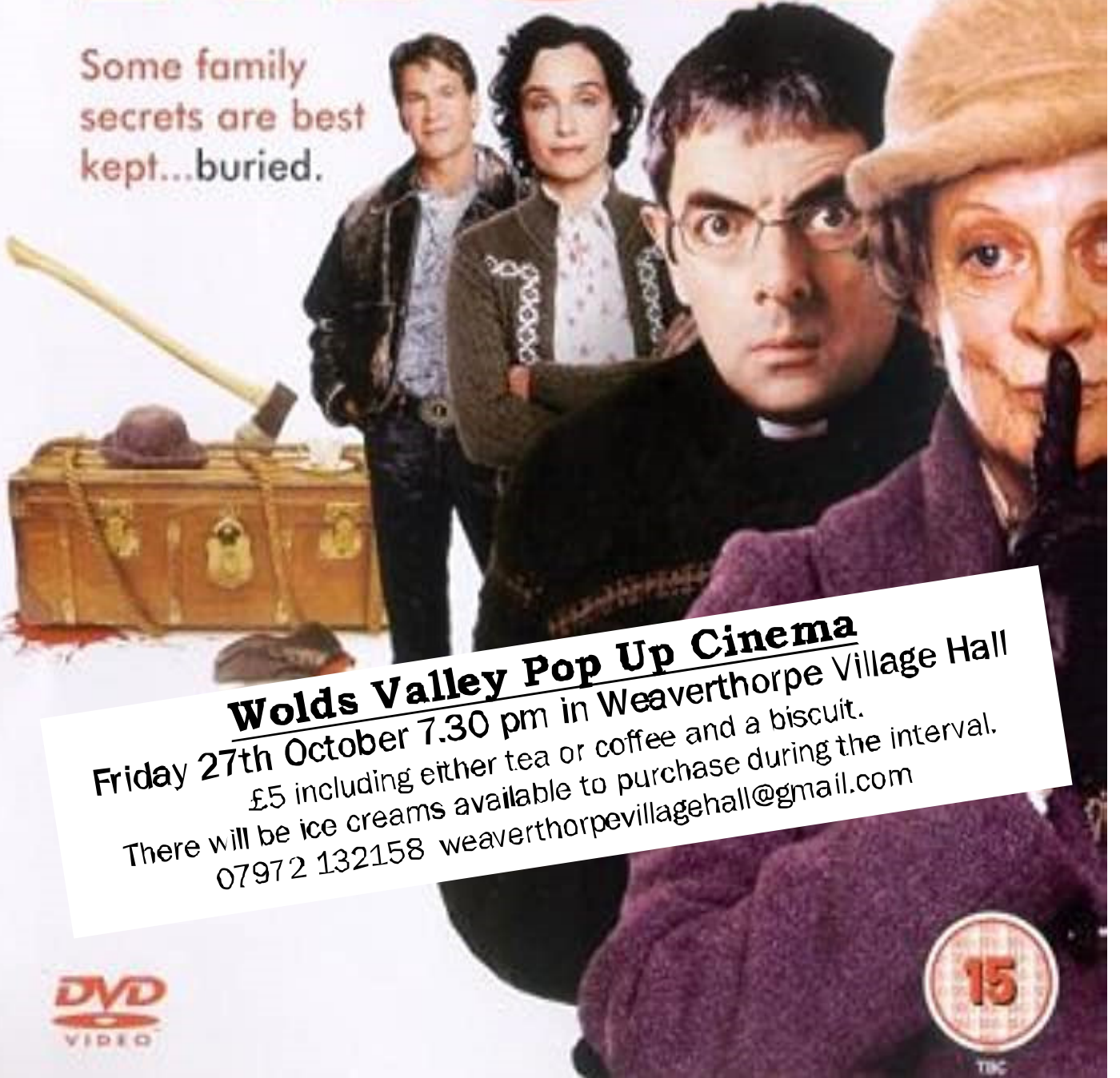

Weaverthorpe Village Green – Play area

It is with frustration that we have to ask the person or persons responsible for tampering with and removing signage from Weaverthorpe Village Green to please stop doing this.

The sign we refer to is one that says “Children’s Play Area – No dogs allowed”. The sign explains that it is a requirement of RoSPA (The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents) who inspect our play area on an annual basis. The reason they ask for it is that dog faeces are a potential health hazard for children. We can understand that if you are a dog owner then the sign may offend you but that person or persons who have removed the sign, on several occasions, are doing so without permission. Under the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, any person who permits a dog in their charge to foul any play area is committing an offence.

Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



National bat weekend came and went ... so one evening was out with the bat detector making sound recordings ... there was plenty of activity with pipistrelle bats ... the heterodyne bat box transforms their activity into clicks and claps ... if you have the machine wound up enough it actually vibrates as the bats fly through ... as usual there were more questions than answers ... when feeding the bat sends out a stream of calls as it approaches its prey ... this comes over like someone blowing a raspberry and these weren't feeding ... so where ..? there are plenty of bat sites on t'internet ... quite a few have ultra sound real time bat calls ... the recorders for this version of bat recording are very expensive ...

The buddleias have been covered in butterflies ... with at times over thirty red admirals ... quite a favourite ... as with many creatures its binomial is interesting ... Vanessa Atalanta ... Vanessa from a Jonathan Swift poem ... Cadmus and Vanessa, about one of his lovers Esther Vanhomrigh ... first three letters of surname and two from first giving Vanessa ... eventually ... Atalanta was a fleet footed Greek goddess ... suckled by a she bear ... after being abandoned ... her suitors had to beat her in a foot race if they wanted her hand in marriage ... if they lost ... they got speared ... some trickery with golden apples sorted that one ...

Grey wagtail was recorded last year ... both sight and sound ... and also this year ... there does seem to be some sort of seasonal movement of these birds ... recording their contact calls on numerous occasions ...

Filey dog walking on the beach has been entertaining ... providing flotillas of guillemots ... particularly if the juveniles are calling ... and the occasional arctic skua ... birds fly ... these agile kleptoparasites FLY big time ... any tern with food is up for a chasing ... once again this is a species with declining numbers ...

The seasons move round ... just hoping the pink-footed geese turn up in the numbers we had last year ...
