A View from County Hall



I have now received an update from NYC Passenger Transport on the issues around the Service 190, also referred to as the "Old Post Bus". Service 190 is supported by the council and is also operated by NYC Fleet Services. NYC are aware that there have been issues

around capacity and raised the matter with colleagues in NYC Fleet Services. The requirements of the vehicle used on Service 190 have changed as the vehicle is now also used on a home to school transport service. Although the issue was resolved in the short term due to summer school holidays, I am informed that NYC have been working on amending the times of the service slightly from the beginning of September to ensure the vehicle used has sufficient seating capacity on all journeys.

A revised timetable will operate from Monday 4th September 2023.

- Current journey 0940 from Foxholes to Malton – no change
 - Current journey 1230 from Malton will now depart 1215
 - Current journey 1325 from Foxholes to Malton will now depart 1310
- Current journey from Malton 1645 Monday to Friday and 1625 on Saturday – no change

The drivers will have a supply of the revised timetable to hand out to passengers.

It's been a quiet month at NYC however at local level, I have had several issues raised by residents regarding Parish Councils and on both sides of the valley. It's worth highlighting that North Yorkshire Council and the 731 separate Parish Councils across the North Yorkshire footprint are completely separate Authorities. Each authority has their own set of duties and neither can influence or has authority over the other. NYC are now the collecting authority for the Parish Council precept, however this part of the Council Tax goes straight to the PC and can only be stopped or amended by the PC themselves. I greatly respect the important work of our local PCs and the hard working volunteers who put themselves forward to be PC councillors. Though they are separate authorities, in my experience, they are always more effective when they build strong relationships with other local authorities including NYC and of course NY Police.

Weaverthorpe Village Green



The sun shone after many days of waiting for the rain to stop, allowing us to go ahead with our plans to install the new fencing on Weaverthorpe Village Green. The new fencing made of recycled plastic is virtually maintenance free and will last much longer than the wooden fencing it is replacing.

It has taken over a year to get to this point, the first donation from the Weaverthorpe Open Gardens group was received in July 2022, since then we have been



applying for various grants, not all successful, and have received other donations to enable Weaverthorpe Parish Council to purchase all the materials for the project at a cost of £7,480. In total the Parish Council has raised £7,475, therefore the project has been funded almost entirely by grants and donations. That means that the Council Tax payers in the village have not had to bear the cost of this fencing through the Precept. In addition the installation costs have been saved, as all the work will have been carried out by volunteers. We estimate that this will have saved a further £3,000 by not having to pay contractors. It is interesting to note that when the replaced fencing was installed back in the mid nineteen nineties, the cost was £500!



The Parish Council would like to thank all the volunteers for their tremendous effort in helping us and hope that those sore backs will soon mend! There will be another working party on the weekend of September 9th and 10th (weather permitting) to complete the project.

Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



Have not used any of the birding apps available for bird identification ... although quite a few organisers of these programs have been in contact to use sound recordings ... generally not with positive outcomes ... a meeting with my brother introduced the Merlin Sound ID ... he enjoys talking about birds and we have conversations about those he has seen ... the app is produced by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and Macaulay Sound Library USA ... basically you point your mobile etc at the bird sound and record ... it produces a sonogram of the recording ... within 30 seconds it will identify your bird ... and it did ... 50m away and we had sedge warbler ... reed bunting ... meadow pipit ... it covers 284 species of the western palearctic ... us ... a few weeks later a recording couldn't identify ... was on a few forums and the general conclusion was a grey wagtail call ... sent the recording to my brother ... came back with hawfinch ... spotted flycatcher ... grey wagtail ... and Mexican jay ... not infallible though no claims to be ...

Haven't been out much of late ... poor sleep patterns ... the weather hasn't helped ... just out with the dog ... still plenty to hear and see ... mewling buzzards ... call and song still from blackcap ... willow warbler ... chiffchaff ... bullfinch ... long-tailed tit ... a late blackbird nest with raucous nestlings ... and standing at the gate transfixed by the comings and goings of the house martins circulating in and around the houses ...
