A View from County Hall



The old saying that “a man’s house is his castle” must surely be a fundamental feeling close to all our hearts. When the county council merged with the existing seven district and borough councils back in April, we were required to have one single policy for all our housing. As we move through the process of developing a five year housing

strategy, many thoughts come to mind, not least the plight of those displaced by the mindless destruction of their homes by war and with little hope of finding even the most basic form of shelter. I personally feel very grateful, not only for the roof over my head, but because I also feel safe under it.

We are all aware of the issues around young people struggling to rent and buy their own homes and often their exit from our villages in order to do so. We also know that there is a strong pull for them to return when they want to grow their families, if the right housing is available. Looking closely at the evidence informing the new strategy is eye watering, so no apologies for sharing a few statistics informing the plan. 619,542 North Yorkshire residents live in 274,381 households, there is an average of 2.24 people per household, 25% of our population is aged over 65, Over 108,000 residents are limited by health and disability, 27% of our housing stock is pre 1919 and the Average house price: £284,000.

The six strands of the new developing plan are to tackle homelessness, meet the needs of the ageing population, increase the supply of affordable and available housing, reduce fuel poverty, decarbonise homes and to bring long term empty properties back into use.

I welcome the chance to feed into this work, but if we are to make a difference, we have to be creative and brave. If you also wish to feed into the plan, there is a live online consultation open now and running until Monday 11th December and you can view it here

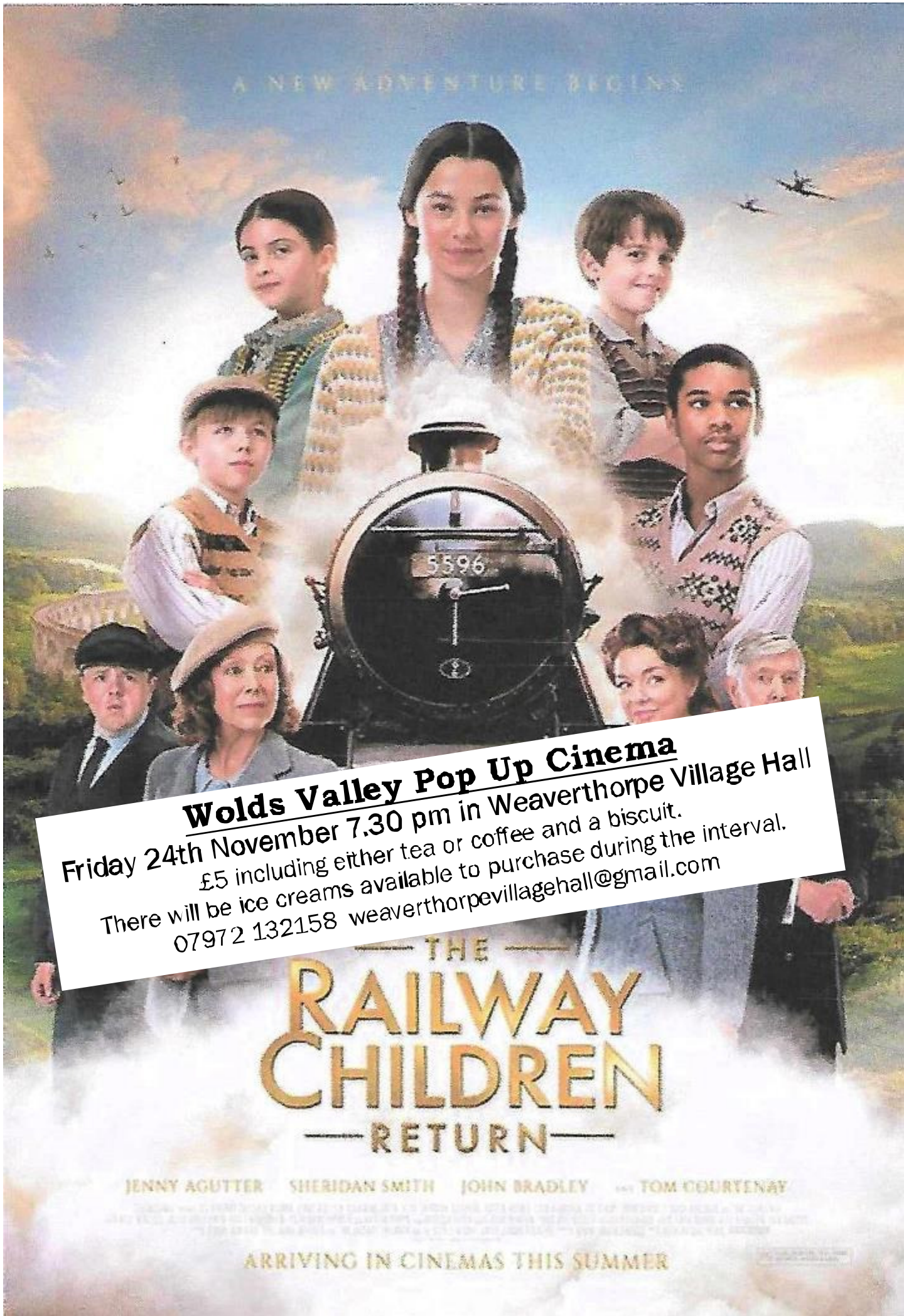

Pop Up Restaurant

We have, yesterday evening, held our third, and very successful, Pop Up Restaurant.

The event was held in Weaverthorpe Village Hall with 23 eager attendees. I say 'eager' because our theme on this occasion was based on Greek cuisine and many, if not all the attendees, have experience of same. On this occasion our 'in house' chef (Hazel Morley) actually taking the time to visit a couple of Greek Islands in order to more fully research her understanding of authentic Greek cooking. To the extent that some of the ingredients of the meal she actually brought back from Crete after her last trip.

The menu consisted of a starter: Prawn Saganaki with Horiatiko Psomi (Prawns in tomato and Feta Cheese served with Greek Village Bread). This was followed by Lamb Kleftiko and Stuffed Peppers (Slow Cooked Lamb and Potatoes cooked in Parchment Paper). And for dessert there was Galactoboureko (Filo Pastry Filled with the **most** Creamy Custard).

The seating arrangements are such that there are eight people per table. The idea being that guests have an opportunity to meet new people and be able to converse, laugh and chat covering whatever topics that might be raised. From the perspective of we the servers and the kitchen staff, it is just amazing that all we hear is the laughter and buzz of conversation. Fabulous!!

Please forgive me this, but here below is a copy of an email from one of our guests which highlights the whole ethos of the event: *"Good morning Martin. I just wanted to say a huge thank you to everyone involved in last night's pop up restaurant. I was so impressed. I genuinely thought it would be (just) tables in a village hall. The time and effort taken to transform it into a space that actually felt like a restaurant turned it into a real dining experience. Not knowing what to expect, I had brought my own wine glass (I used yours because it was much nicer!). Everything was spot on (although some of the waiting staff could use extra training :)). The food was absolutely delicious and I sincerely hope that if you have another pop up restaurant, you let me know. Thanks again."*

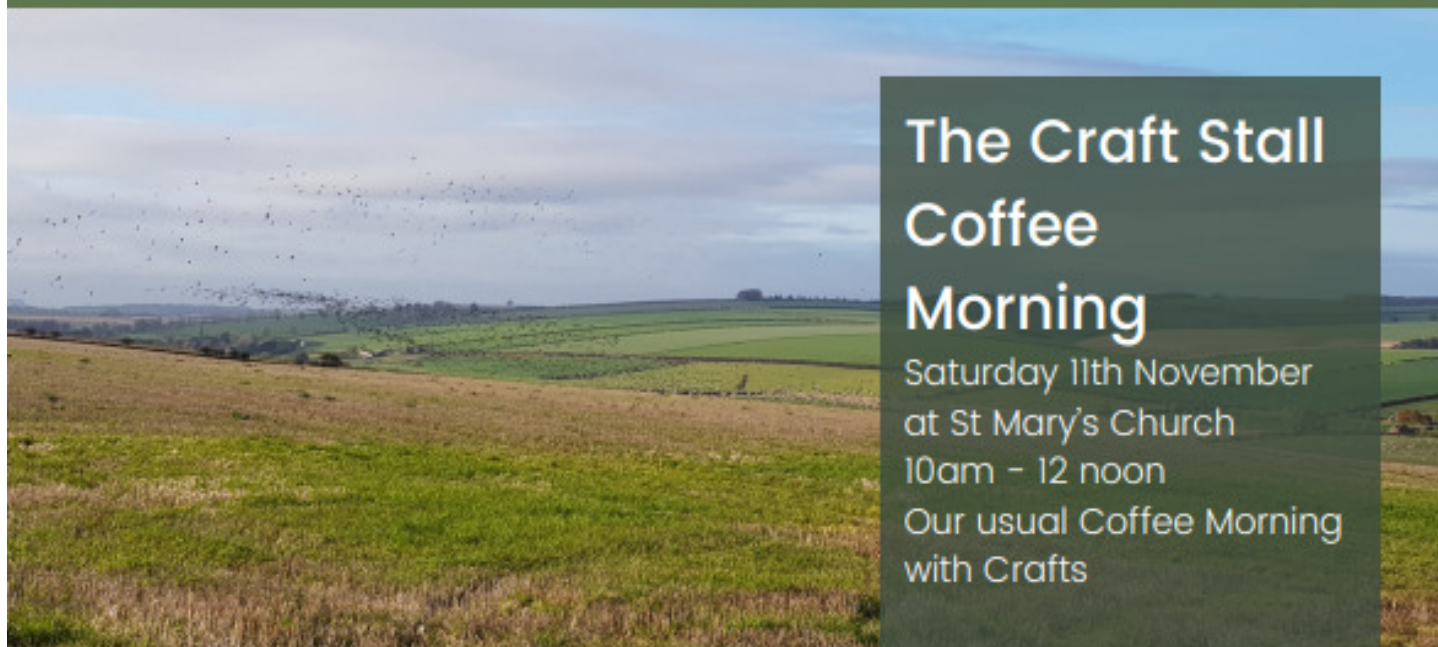

Helpertorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



The seasons move round and our new arrivals will become resident over the next few months ... Mrs M has now got the Merlin bird ID app on her phone and was quick off the mark finding both the first for us of redwing and fieldfare ... the last week a flock of 250+ redwing flying over in 10 minutes was great to see and hear ... also some 50 fieldfare over in the same time caused some entertainment ... pink-footed have also passed through our air space ... 150 on one occasion ... 250 on another ... not sure when a flock becomes a skein ?? in smaller numbers ... basically singles ... have heard brambling and siskin and lesser redpoll ... the last two are resident ... though much appreciated ... still had chiffchaff around well into mid October ...

An article in the current RSPB magazine made for some sombre reading ... it has always been acknowledge the decline in bird numbers ... some examples ... spotted flycatchers 77% ... corn buntings 88% ... tree sparrows 95% ... am very thankful that the last two birds listed are still part of our local bird life ... the author of the article sites that some people will never hear the gentle purring of the turtle dove ... and that the most ubiquitous bird of summer ... the willow warbler is also facing severe deletion in numbers particularly down south ...

Have a perchant for sound recording inside and outside churches ... interior ambience and exterior church yard soundscapes ... a visit to St Peters Wintringham became a bit more than that ... the church is open though not for worship ... was ... is ... one of many churches in the bats in churches scheme ... it has four screens depicting the project and much info to do with bats and their lives ... if you go to on a wing and a prayer art installation website there is 2 hours 30mins of bat calls and associated sound ... sounds more like a submariners convention ... follow on to soundcloud and there is a full explanation of the immersive batscapes sounds and how the sounds were adapted for human consumption ... the church has four residents ... long-eared brown ... common pipistrelle ... soprano pipistrelle ... and natterers bats ...
