aware of the complexities of aging and how historic baby boomers, restricting families to one child, greater freedom for women and a multitude of other factors has given rise to the fact that we will soon have as many children

under 15 as there will be adults over 64.

Last month Professor Chris Whitty visited North Yorkshire as part of his research for his annual report. He met with representatives from key partner agencies to provide scene setting for the locality, and the healthy ageing rural agenda more widely. He said that the medical profession need to adapt to an ageing population. Improving the quality of life for older citizens should be a major aim of policy and medical practice. He noted that successive governments and professional bodies had not recognised the degree to which the population living in older age is concentrating geographically - that is a very pertinent point in respect of our Wolds villages. The rise of multiple conditions in the same older person requires changes in medical training, NHS services and research. He emphasised that we need to focus on how to maximise the independence and minimise the time in ill-health between reaching older age and the end of life. Quality, enjoyment and independence should be the principle aims. After reading these headline statements, I am in total agreement with him. Here in our Wolds villages, the strength of our communities and working with our NYC adult social care is instrumental in achieving these aims.

When we see such trouble around the world, it is easy to become disheartened. As we move into the Christmas season, I think we should all take a dose of professor Whitty's medicine and put "enjoyment" at the top of our list - at least for the festive season!

Highlight of the last month was ... a pheasant clattered into view ... thought it was being chased or chasing a sparrowhawk ... as the birds drew level a long bill and erratic flight meant it was a woodcock ... probably my only one for the year though always very welcome ... also very welcome have been some large flocks of winter visitors ... fieldfare at least 600+ on one occasion with 150+ redwing in their midst ... and 500+ pink-footed geese heading east down the valley ... the occasional brambling has been heard ... never stumble on a flock ... of the locals 30+ corn bunting ticcing was a welcome sight ... and sound ... the resident great spotted woodpecker has been spotted ... sorry ... and a barn owl at boythorpe added to the fun ...

A new breeding bird for the UK was found in Cambridgeshire ... a glossy ibis ... a fledgling was found along with up to 12 adults in a colony ... the species has been observed over many years throughout the year at many favoured haunts ... also bee eaters bred ... what a joy they would be ...


