As we begin to see many local councils in financial difficulties and struggling to deliver anything other than the most basic statutory services, the move to a new unitary NYC has thankfully saved us for the same fate - for time being.

No one likes change, but we need to move with the times. If change is managed sensitively and works with existing communities and authorities then there is hope for the future.

Whatever your hopes for the future, I wish you and your loved ones every success for a happy and prosperous New Year 2024.

A sort of review of sound recording highlights of the year ... top of the list was the sedge warbler in May ... no rarity just the opportunity to record for



lay ... no rarity just the opportunity to record for almost two hours straight ... an ebullient songster with all sorts of trills ... whistles and imitation ... also to be so close huddled behind the parabolic ... next a few nest recordings ... willow warbler ... chiffchaff ... particularly when the male accompanies the females visits with song ... and a first in recording of a crow nestling ... just prior to it becoming a fledgling ... the adults are so wary ... so it was set the gear up and retreat ... November was good for recording pink-footed geese in a bay

up in Northumberland ... recording the birds as they came into and out of a roosting site ... the word area might be better ... never the same place ... just chuffing brilliant ... on one occasion an uncountable number of crows ... rooks ... jackdaws ... assembled on a sandbank before parties headed off in different directions to get on with their day ...

Occasionally donate or get asked for recordings ... a new book ... Sound Identification of Terrestrial Mammals Brita in and Ireland ... Middleton ... Newson ... Pearce ... has only one recording of a mole ... and its one of mine ... bless ... never really seen much in the way of badgers ... the book lists the incredible diversity of sounds associated with their behaviour ... snarling ... growling ... hisses ... snorts ... yelps ... grunts ... screams ... keckering ... purrs ... churrs ... chittering ... perhaps one day ..? a set ended up being used by the Spinnies Aberogwen Nature reserve ... no comment on Whale with Steve Backshall ...

Out and about there seems to be plenty of fieldfare and redwing frequenting the hedgerows ... a group of long-tailed tits had a treecreeper in their midst ... Mrs M has been recording great

spotted woodpecker on her phone ... some small flocks of corn bunting about ... up to 15 in the biggest so far ... and a calling brambling ... a number of raptor species ... buzzard ... sparrowhawk ... kestrel ... one year had a hen harrier male ... here's hoping ... David Mellor
