elect a Mayor for the very first time. This is because The City of York Council and North Yorkshire Council have agreed to form a Combined Authority working together across the combined footprint of both authorities.

The role of the Combined Authority is to use some of the money and powers, that up to now have been held by central government, and work with local leaders and communities to invest in ways that will help to make York and North Yorkshire a better place for us to live, work and do business. The Combined Authority will look to grow the economy over the area, help to make communities safer, and deliver strategies and projects attracting funding and investment. The Combined Authority Board is made up of two councillors from City of York Council and two from North Yorkshire Council and is led by a Mayor for whom you will soon be given a vote to elect.

The Mayor and the combined authority will have certain powers and responsibilities, devolved to them by the Government and an investment of £540 million to be spent over the next 30 years. They will have powers to improve the supply and quality of housing and funds to improve skills and

training. North Yorkshire Council will for the most part continue to deliver vital local services for where we live. The Combined Authority will have a more strategic view of the region for services such as transport, infrastructure and skills. It will also include the duties of the Police Fire and Crime Commissioner.

At the other end of the scale, I continue to work at a very local level to progress the rural pilot Community Partnership often referred to as "Double Devolution". Though this is still in its early days, I am already sharing the ideas with other NYC members and other Parish Councils. If the project is successful, it will not expand incrementally but "lift and shift" to other rural areas ensuring the partnership always remains as intended - "Local".



#### **Helperthorpe Bird Notes**

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



Highlight of the past months was a short eared owl crossing the A64 near Heslerton ... what a sight ... all five seconds of it ..! would love to watch the male display flight on the breeding ground ... they clap their wings under their body ... much of the winter have been following two brothers following the East Atlantic flyway from Europe down the West African coast ... ending up in Cape Town ... one is a photographer ... the other a sound recordist ... in following the migrating birds they spend three weeks recording ... then one week engaging students and the public with an immersive experience using virtual reality headsets ... they post clips ... blogs and reels on their website ... and Facebook ... go look on ... sounding wild ... their recording of a sedge warbler practising its song in a thicket ... always wonder where it will end up ... how many miles will it cover ..? some great shots of a great white pelican colony.

Closer to home ... back gardens in fact ... have made quite a few long sound recordings of a song thrush ... and thanks to a neighbour have at least 20+ hours of frogs and toads spawning in his garden pond ... just set up the mics ... walk away ... return some 12 hours later ... initial recording wasn't good ... absolutely nothing then at 02.00 it all kicked off ... the frogs ribbit ... croak ... toads quark ... plop ... parp ..? quite a few of the recordings have very little background noise ... thumbs up to that ... still a lot to learn ... apparently frogs scream when approached by a predator ..

On the bird front most of the local residents are setting up territories ... good to hear green finch and the very occasional grey partridge ... great tits and blue tits still intrigue with the plethora and variety of their calls and songs ... and mimicry ... quite a few fieldfare about still ... a flock of 150+ was the largest ... also coot ..? often when leaving mics out over night you occasionally hear birds moving through the valley ... have had teal ... dunlin ... coot seems to be a regular ... whether like moorhen they use the dotted dew ponds in the area ..?





Presenting three concerts in the spring of 2024 (27 April, 12 May and 25 May), followed by two concerts in the autumn and a special Christmas celebration, 'RISING STARS at SLEDMERE' will bring the future stars of the classical music world to perform in this magnificent family home.

THEO ELWES, violin KUMI MATSUO, piano

The first recital will be performed by the talented and charismatic British/American violinist, **Theo Elwes**, accompanied by award-

winning Japanese pianist **Kumi Matsuo**. The duo will present an Eastern European-inspired programme opening with Bartók's charming 'Romanian Folk Dances', a suite of six short pieces based on Romanian tunes from Transylvania and among the Hungarian composer's most popular works.
