A View from County Hall



The new unitary council is now officially in its second year and at last, we are beginning to have some of the real benefits it brings. At our recent May AGM council meeting, one of the most positive decisions was around the new housing strategy. NYC is now a housing authority and although it has retained the knowledge and experience of the seven previous district housing authorities, a strategy has to be developed to align all areas within the new geography of NYC.

The strategy provides a framework for housing policies, and projects up until 2029. It is aimed at helping to address the demand for more housing and this includes the deeply rural parts of North Yorkshire. There are many challenges to providing housing across a vast rural county, but local government reorganisation has given us the opportunity to bring big changes to our communities and the people who need the most help.

The strategy focuses on three key priorities - our people, our places and our homes, with references to quality, affordability and sustainability. It aims to deliver at least 500 more council homes, and particularly mentions the issue of the rural housing crisis as well as supporting communities through regeneration. We know that people's housing requirements change as they move through life's changes and the plan recognises the needs of the population at different life stages. If we are to retain young people and families in our rural villages, we have to address their housing needs to sustain vibrant communities and services. The plan is a good start to this vision.

Despite the extraordinary courage displayed by so many on 6th June 1944, just one Victoria Cross was awarded. It went to Company Sergeant Major Stanley Hollis of the 6th Battalion, The Green Howards.



Chinese naval officer Huang Tingxin received the French Legion d'honneur, the highest order of military and civil honours that France bestows, 2006 in recognition of his bravery during D-Day.

Preparation for D — Day in the Wolds!

Just a little story about me in 1943 leading up to D-Day. I was four years old at the time and living in a lone house at the side of the road between Wetwang and Tibthorpe. One night a Sherman tank got stuck in our Stick hill at back of the house. Next morning my younger brother and i were invited to sit in the tank. The tank crew were French men and for many years that bugged me why French servicemen In a Sherman tank. My family moved to the Weaverthorpe area in 1952. Years later i decided to do a search. Early in 1943 the East Yorkshire Wolds was to become an Armoured Division training area. In early May all the sheep in the Weaverthorpe/West Lutton and surrounding areas were gathered together to be sold off. Weaverthorpe that time was still in East Yorkshire. The Guards Armoured Division and 11th Armoured Division then moved into the area with all their supporting units of which there were many to beat up for D-Day. Ernie Teal who used to write stories in the Driffield Times, Walkington Hayride and such was Tank Commander with the Guards Division and stayed at Butterwick and Spaniel farm. I had a long phone conversation with a chap from down south who was supporting Infantry for 11th Armoured Division. He said he woke up one morning beside his armoured vehicle cold wet and covered in snow on his 21st birthday. He still remembered the Map ref for Octon crossroads as they attacked it in training many times. Both stories are too long for these few notes and as for the French men their Division came over from Morocco some time near D-Day and trained around here before D-day and later on were given the privilege of taking Paris in 1944. The French Lads did meet local girls and attended local dances in West Lutton, again that's another story. But just to end, note the phone numbers on the sheep sale advert. Chris Howe

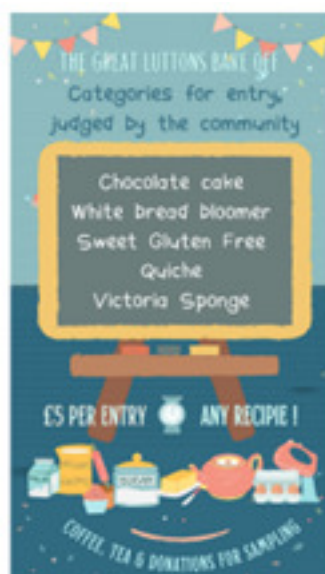

Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



As they say on all podcasts ... let's get into it ... or something of that sort ... glad to see all the hirundines returned ... have equal love for each species ... all fill a different niche ... everybody seems to have a returning swallow day ... with a neighbour it was his April birth date ... with me ... just happy to have them in my company as once the alarm call is learnt that denizen of the winged anti hero ... the sparrowhawk ... can't move across the territory without a pack chasing his tail ... it has happened a few times last year of a hobby chasing the house martins ... will leave the swifts to their pell mell race tracking round the buildings ... if you are lucky ...

On the migrant watch and sound recording ... most seem to have returned ... willow warbler in a few paces ... lesser whitethroat ... one singing around the buildings ... whitethroat ... blackcap and for once in some time a garden warbler ... both birds often cause problems with the similarity of their song ... the blackcaps is just ebullient ... loud phrases often with much mimicry particularly nightingale ... one a few years ago ... thought found a new species for the uk ... the garden warbler's ... like to compare to a small drinking fountain ... it bubbles along in a stream of notes ... generally at the same level and volume ... the blackcap has his black cap ... the female's is brown ... many have over wintered ... the garden warbler is basically plain ... no colour or eye stripes apart variations on the wash of brown and they are skulkers ...

Needless to say one or two species seem to be losers on a local and national level ... have not heard a turtle dove ... and the last cuckoo heard in the area was in 2010 ... this year have yet to hear a yellow wagtail ... must be more patient ...

As usual the local birds are with us ... a goldcrest must be nesting somewhere adjacent ... will have to figure how to some way get the gear in without parading around with a parabolic in front of a house ..? and as usual expect the unexpected ... rounding Staxton roundabout and having to duck under the windshield ... as a peregrine falcon gave me five seconds of its time ... and belated thanks to a local resident for reporting a buzzard in his back garden ...

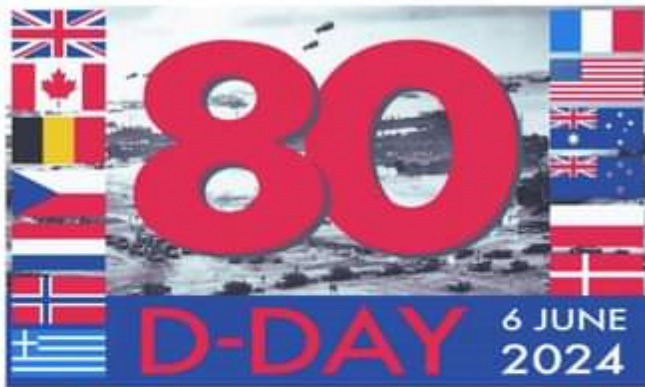

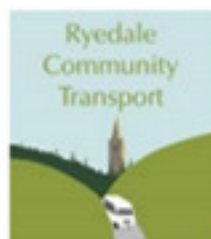
