A View from County Hall



In May this year, a consultation was started on the designation of an area of the Yorkshire Wolds becoming a National Landscape. This designation was previously referred to as an Area Of Outstanding National Beauty (AONB). Unfortunately, politics in the form of the Mayoral Election, followed shortly after by the General Election got in the way and the consultation had to be postponed. Natural England representatives, North Yorkshire Council and East Riding Officers have recently met, and the consultation is now at the stage where it can be relaunched, hopefully in the second week of October. If the designation does go ahead, it will be one of three National Landscapes within North Yorkshire along with the two National Parks. There will be mixed views around the designation and inevitably some unintended consequences. Recently we have been set new government targets for minimum housing development of over 4,000 dwelling houses per annum. It will be a huge challenge to find enough building land to feed this request, especially as it is highly likely to be restricted in the National Landscapes. The need for housing has to be addressed and given priority, however if we genuinely want the right development in the right place, this must be plan led. Work is ongoing to merge the seven district development plans into one NYC plan and it is hoped that this will be completed within the five year time frame.

Returning to the consultation on The Wolds designation, The Wolds landscape is stunning, and I am pleased it is now being considered for national recognition. I would urge Wolds residents to give their views at this important stage.

You could be a school governor

Sherburn and Luttons Primaries have joined Ebor Academy Trust, a multi-academy trust of 25 Yorkshire primary schools.

We are recruiting governors. If you are looking for an inspiring opportunity to become involved in governance at a primary school, then we would welcome your application. We are looking for governors of all ages and backgrounds to help to drive our ambition for the children we serve.

What will you be doing?

Ebor Academy Trust is a values-led multi-academy trust – a family of schools with a sense of responsibility for each other.

Governors on local governing bodies have a significant role to play in providing an external perspective on the strategic direction of the school, bringing enthusiasm, and experience from other areas of life. They work as a well balanced group of people to support the headteacher and staff in driving the school forward. Local governing bodies within the Trust normally meet five times per year at the school, but governors

are encouraged to be actively involved in their schools, wherever possible. Training will be provided to help you in your role. Being a governor makes you think about how and why schools work well, and how – without being hands-on – you can use your life skills and experience to support and challenge people working in them to be as effective as possible. Some of the best advocates for our children are those who have recently gone through the education system and understand

what it takes to enjoy school, achieve and make a positive contribution to society. Ebor consists of small village schools, large urban schools, schools in challenging circumstances and one school supporting pupils with special educational needs. Our schools operate in geographic hubs in York, Selby, Hull, North Yorkshire and in the East Riding and the Humber.

What are we looking for?

You need to be able to work as part of a team, be committed to collective responsibility and have the ability to think strategically. You will need to be passionate about children's life chances. We welcome applicants from a wide range of backgrounds. You will need to be comfortable with finding the time to read a number of papers to prepare for meetings, and confident to ask challenging questions and learn about the school. Ideally, you will be able to come into school during the school day for school visits, perhaps for a minimum of three times per year. Being a governor is the most important voluntary role in education. An effective governing body can be a source of strength to the school, helping it to look for the best solutions. This position offers the chance to make serious differences at a local level.

What's in it for the volunteer?

You will gain ongoing challenges and new learning about interesting and important aspects of the work of the school. You will be valued in this role and will have access to the training you need to be most effective. You will keep up to date with changes in national and local policy affecting schools and will be well placed to see the difference this makes on the ground.

Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



Big thanks to two local residents ... the first for phoning in a record of an osprey at Sherburn ... what a great tick ... the second for showing me a pheasant's nest ... have never seen a nest let alone any fledglings ... the nest was in a stubble field ... only giving away its position by two tail feathers moving with the breeze ... otherwise it was completely flat to the ground ... the nest was just a shallow scrape in the soil ... eventually the eleven eggs were found to be addled ... she had laid late in the season ... though they can be found with eggs in late September ...

Moving further afield ... so to speak ... Tophill Low nature reserve has been playing host to rarities ... a pair of blue-winged teal ... first seen August 2023 ... the birds originate from Canada ... wintering in the USA ... they turn up in small numbers each year ... it was thought they attempted to nest in the river hull valley somewhere ... appearing to use the nature reserve as a base the rest of the time ... many hopes on their activity next year ...

Been on gardening leave recently ... what does that mean ..? only just getting out this last few weeks ... plenty to keep up with ... three juvenile buzzards have been filling the air space with their calls and plenty of sky diving ... up to four chiffchaffs have been in hedgerows and even in the garden ... a mixture of calls and song ... they seem to know when their bodyweight has reached its optimum level they will be off on their journeys ... also a singleton goldcrest ... hobby ... tawny owl ... and a flock of golden plover overhead at 23:00 ... pink-footed geese have been moving through the valley ... Mrs M while out dog walking has recorded the most so far ... a skein of 60 ... there are still a small number of house martins still with fledglings in the nest ... they may be too late to complete their migration ...

Some butterflies ... speckled wood ... red admiral ... tortoiseshell ... no painted ladies ... or hummingbird hawk moth ...

So here's to fieldfare and redwing in the coming months ... and just one waxwing ... possibly ..?

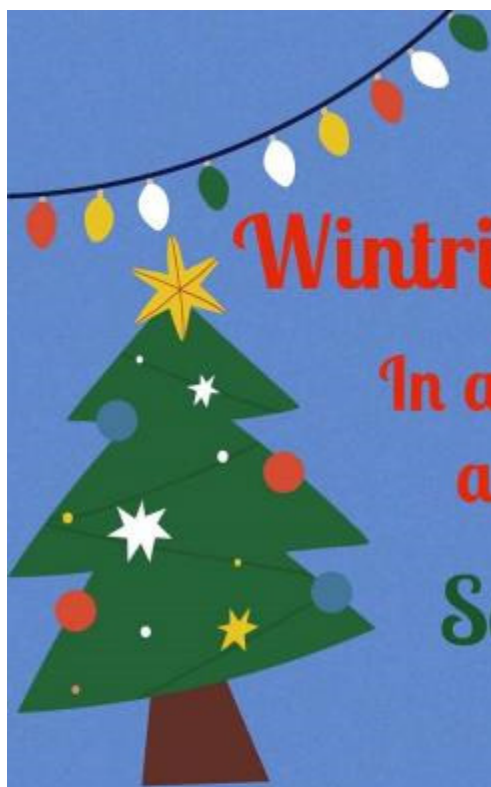

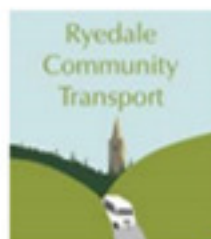
