A View from County Hall



As I write, I am watching the news of hurricane Milton battering Florida. I don't think any of us can be anything other than shocked and moved by the devastating scenes left in its wake and the impact it has had on the local communities.

Impressive scenes display long lines of huge service trucks like cherry pickers on steroids, all driving in convoy to fix power cables and damaged infrastructure. The level of emergency preparation and mobilisation of plans appearing to be carried out with military precision.

As winter fast approaches, the recovery scenes from Florida have to be a lesson for us all. Of course, "prevention is better than cure" but should the inevitable happen, then emergency planning can help to limit damage or even in some cases, prevent it. Across Yorkshire and the Humber, the four Local Resilience Forums have joined forces for a region-wide project to improve emergency preparedness and resilience across communities and businesses. The '[Yorkshire Ready Together](#)' project provides real-time, two-way, emergency preparedness advice via a free AI tool, which is accessible online or by mobile phone messaging. Yorkshire Ready Together highlights the importance of business and community resilience and the issues faced in our region. These issues include: power outages; cyber security threats; severe weather (extreme heat or cold, storms, etc); flooding; water outage; major accidents/fires; pandemics; or animal health.

Having had a quick tour around the Yorkshire Ready Together web site and had a conversation with a (for want of a better word) robot, I am struck by two things, firstly the amount of information available, and secondly how we remain polite even when conversing with a robot. I would urge all community leaders to taper this tool to fit specifically local need and get a very simple plan in place for known local risks. It could be the Wolds version of the Home Guard!

No more tickler's marmalade.



Private George Crozier, 1st Battalion, the Green
Howards
1915-1918



Born during the First World War in 1901, Private George Crozier, 1st Battalion, the Green Howards, was killed in the Somme area of France, at an unknown point in the First World War, but his exact whereabouts are unknown. He was taken to the Queen Victoria Hospital on the Green Howards, but had passed away before he arrived. Private Crozier had been serving with the 1st Battalion, the Queen's Royal Fusiliers, in Gallipoli. The Green Howards' journal, 'Pals', recorded the passing of St. Michael's Fusiliers. It was a young man, young Private Crozier, who was serving with the 1st Battalion, the Queen's Royal Fusiliers, who had been killed by a shell. Private Crozier, aged 17, had been killed by a shell. He was 17 years old.



Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



RSPB Bempton played host to ... in twitchers terms a giga ... mega tick ... their interest totally focussed on a wee bundle of feathers ... the bird in question ... a pale-legged leaf warbler ... breeds in eastern China and North Korea ... wintering in the Malay peninsula ... this was the second live record for the UK and the western Palearctic ... and reports of 600 birders turning up to see said rarity on one day ... the overflow car park must have extended as far as Filey ..? Moving on to Filey ... a recent dog walk on the beach resulted in skeins and skeins of pink-footed geese ... air traffic control must have almost been overwhelmed ... there for an hour and the number must have been well over 2,000 in total ... they just kept coming ... have been to one or two roosts on the Northumberland coast ... and the blizzard of wings and the cacophony of 9,000 birds cranking into the sky ... just amazing ...

Locally the birds have kept the interest going ... lucky enough to have two red kites ... two buzzards and a kestrel all ridge riding together .. ish ... long-tailed tits have been bouncing down the hedgerows ... most seen ... a group of 15 ... have heard golden plover ... seen a number of redwing ... biggest group so far numbered 15 ... the hedgerows don't seem to have much in the way of berries etc this autumn ..? flocks of yellowhammers complimented by chaffinch and goldfinch ... a male sparrowhawk torpedoed into hedge after some house sparrows ... it flew out immediately to try its luck elsewhere ...

My knowledge of moths is pretty limited ... my favourite is based on its name ... not the moth itself ... so setaceous Hebrew character it is ... setaceous meaning consisting of bristles ... found a very large ... very desiccated type of hawk moth ... it was big and by the angle of one wing and the use of the field guide to moths of GB and Ireland ... it was a privet hawk moth ... not a rare species by any means and one that has progressed up the country ... 72 records for Yorkshire last year ... stay safe folks
