Moving towards the second year of the new North Yorkshire Council, we are beginning to reap the benefits of reorganisation. As we set the third budget, £89 million of savings have been or are planned to be delivered as a result of the move to a unitary authority and working together. This has for the most part been achieved with little impact to front line services.

One of the upcoming decisions to be made is around ensuring that waste collection is the same across the county. This means that we will all see a change to the service. Under the previous two tiers of local government the duties were split between the seven District and Borough Councils who collected the waste, and North Yorkshire County Council who disposed of the waste. The previous district councils all used different models of collection and together with new government legislation, it was clear that the coordination of collection and disposal could be done more efficiently. Cost isn't the only factor in making changes to a service, however, the favoured model at the moment and the one which gives us the option of delivering the highest overall cost reduction, is the one which the Selby area are currently using. There would be three separate wheeled bins, the one for household waste, would remain the same, a fortnightly collection. The two recycling bins would separate paper and cardboard from cans, glass and plastics, this would reduce processing costs and has the added advantage of generating income. The individual recycle bins would alternate with the household waste bins, in effect meaning they were emptied in a three week cycle.

Of course, it is recognised that a "one size fits all" across North Yorkshire would not suit everyone. In some areas, a bespoke arrangement would have to be made, for example to accommodate those without space to store three bins. On the whole, general feedback has been positive and residents in Selby have said that it's easier to wheel out bins rather than lift the recycling bins which can at times get quite heavy - depending on how many parties you had over Christmas!

As I write, the decision has not yet been made. I never thought that rubbish would make such an interesting debate!





Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



Have plenty of bird guides so coming up with a newer one was all down to a local resident ... the book in question is the Crossley ID Guide ... Crossley and Couzens ... came out in 2014 ... a photographic guide ... once very much frowned upon ... species are placed in a habitat background and then placed within ... the blackbird has 13+ pictures ... bird in flight ... male ... female ... juvenile ... comparison with song thrush ... all of varying sizes ... and not all looking left ... or right ... most of the plates are very good ... mind you if you wish to find a red-throated pipit you may have to go to a cricket match ..? all in all good value ... bought second hand ... free postage ... around about £5:00 ...

Another addition to the shelves is a fluffy royal albatross toy .. squeeze it and it plays its song ... two family friends went to New Zealand ... and visited the centre where these birds can be observed ... members of the great albatross family they have a wingspan +- 3m ... they also saw wandering albatross which are even bigger ... my member of the family flew most of the way home ...

Very rarely see woodcock ... once a year and then only for some 10 seconds ... so an article in British Birds was of much interest ... have recorded the males roding display flight ... the strangest of songs ... two deep croaks then two whistles ... xeno-canto org has some good examples ... male



and female have white reflective panels in the underside of their tails ... these can be used in display ...distraction ... etc ... the flashing produces a blinking effect similar to cats eyes ... all adapted to the low light levels the creatures exist in ...



On the home front ... three kites over Winteringham and one at Haverdale on the same day was a great plus ... the great tits and blue tits seem to be cranking up their songs ... the most common bird at present is the coal tit both in the garden and out in the field ... looking forward to getting out and back to sound recording.


