A View from County Hall



As we move forward into spring and the next financial year, it is an opportune time to assess our current position. To this end, I list some of the key headlines set out by our council leader Cllr. Carl Les below.

We continue to be a Conservative-led Council, building on over 25 years of stable local government, making sound financial decisions.

Demand continues to rise for services, especially older people. This is good as it means more people are living longer.

There is increasing demand for children with special educational needs, including their transport. Our transport bill has risen from £20m before Covid, to over £50m now. Regrettably, this has forced us to take the unpopular decisions of moving closer to the statutory minimum for home to school transport.

The financial situation is dire and the new government appear to have little understanding of the costs and pressures faced by rural councils.

Our Rural Service Delivery Grant of £14.3m has been stopped at a single stroke and without any transition period. This is adding hugely to our financial challenges. NYC has faced the largest hit of all rural councils.

We have mounted a legal challenge to this as the decisions behind it are not sound. The government has said there is no evidence rural services cost more, rural areas are affluent, and we have put this grant into unnecessary reserves. We reject all these assertions.

Fortunately we have made savings of nearly £40m because of combining 8 councils in North Yorkshire. We have reduced the number of senior managers and will continue to dispose of unnecessary buildings.

However we will still have to raise Council Tax by the maximum 5% allowed. Actually this is what government have said they expect us to do.

We are addressing the affordable housing crisis by allocating all our second homes council tax precept into housing schemes. We are the first and only council to do this.

It will be a challenge to find new sites and then deliver the new mandatory housing targets of over 4200 houses per year. In addition, we don't think there is capacity in the construction industry. If we don't deliver, govt will either fine us ie you, or take planning decisions in London.

Heavy snow then lingering sub-zero temperatures was a surprise recently and caused significant disruption. Normally our winter weather events are very wet, but mild. We are doing an internal review of winter activities in case snow and ice becomes more frequent.

We have just about managed to hang on to the members locality budget which has over the last 10 years supported many of the small communities across the Wolds. That said, it has been reduced back to its original grant of £5k because of the Rural Raid on Resources.

Essential to the council's success is working with you, listening to your concerns and priorities. To this end, we have set up a series of consultation forums with you and officers. You are welcome to attend our Area Committee meetings and of course you always have a line of contact to myself.







Helperthorpe Bird Notes

An occasional series from a local birder and sound recordist.



Most of my sound recordings are the common place birds in any locality ... so it is much appreciated when serendipity turns up ... a recent holiday in Wales one of the local birds was a pair of red-billed choughs ... the binomial pyrrhocarax phyrrocarax ... latin for fire bird or fire raven ... more of that later ... they are superb birds ... even in cloudy



conditions they have a glossy black sheen ... they have succulent red bills and legs ... in sunlight they just must glow ... their call is chiach or klaach ... described as a cutting almost whizzing sound ... along with others ... chiaa ... chrai ... chi ah ... tschrach ... the wonderful world of bird phonetical sound ... also they fly ... not lower case ... they FLY ... their progress through the air is assured and wonderful ... occasionally they appear to have the haphazard flight of a butterfly ...

Back through the centuries the bird has been persecuted and become the centre of myths and legends ... being in the crow family it was regarded as an odious bird ... it was believed that the bird could carry burning embers and drop these on the thatch roofs of houses ... hence the fire bird ... not too sure how you would explain that on a modern insurance form ... it was a bird found in the images of heraldic symbols ... in Arthurian legend the king changed into a chough ...

It is a bird of coastal cliffs feeding on the short grazed grassland ... in particularly where cattle and sheep are kept ... probing through their droppings for invertebrates ... the reasons for the birds decline seem manifold ... they were taken as pets ... habitat loss ... egg collectors ... at one stage Cornwall was the only place where this once abundant bird could be found ... there has been a turn round for the species and recently a relocation scheme in Kent seems to be producing results ...



The birds of Anglesey have been readily monitored ... a local resident told of the fact that many local birds are called Mr and Mrs ... name of bay or location ... as many of the birds have a leg iron and a coloured ring ... or rings for identification ... the coming and goings of the birds can be watched with interest ...

Anyhow some good memories and recordings at the start of the year




