Struggling in silence: The hidden health crisis facing farmers
A new report from Healthwatch North Yorkshire has uncovered a growing healthcare crisis affecting farmers and rural communities across the county. Many are living with physical pain, mental strain, and increasing isolation—yet struggle to access the help they need due to long working hours, travel distances, and stigma around seeking support.

“Farmers are resilient, but they’re not invincible,” one farmer told Healthwatch. With over 6,000 farms and 85% of the county classed as very rural, farming is essential to the local economy. But behind the resilience, 74% of farmers reported physical pain, 42% live with stress or anxiety, and 31% struggle with sleep. One said: *“We feel cut off. There’s no time to get help—and nowhere close enough to go.”*

This isn’t just a local issue—it’s part of a national trend. Suicide rates among farmers remain among the highest of any profession and 95% of farmers under 40 affected by mental health. The report calls for urgent action: more mobile health clinics, flexible GP appointments that align with the farming calendar, better mental health support, and investment in local services that meet farmers where they are.

Thanks to your feedback, change is already happening. Health checks are being trialled at Selby and Hawes auction marts. GP practices such as Central Dales are responding to the findings. New community-based initiatives, including cancer screening buses and social prescribing support, are in development. Even local vets are helping signpost farmers to health services.

Healthwatch has shared the report with NHS leaders, rural charities, and North Yorkshire Council, which now plans to form a working group to improve rural healthcare. This is just the start—but real progress is being made.

I do hope that sharing this article will help farmers across the Wolds feel that they are not alone with their issues.







Christopher Simon Sykes: On tour with the Rolling Stones 1975.

A 50th anniversary exhibition of photographs of the Rolling Stones Tour of the Americas 1975 by Christopher Simon Sykes.



In June 1975, Christopher Sykes, joined the Rolling Stones Tour of the Americas, known as T.O.T.A '75. It was his first ever Rock n' Roll tour as a photographer, having previously specialised in photographing the interiors of Stately Homes. The job had come about after a chance meeting the Stones' financial manager, Prince Rupert Loewenstein, who told him that the band were looking for someone to put together a diary of their upcoming tour of the USA. After flying to America to meet the band and apply for the job, Christopher found himself back in England awaiting a decision that never seemed to come. When Prince Rupert told him that he thought the project wasn't going to happen, because he couldn't get Mick to make up his mind, he thought he'd call Mick anyway to hear the decision from the horse's mouth. "What, Rupert told you I didn't want you on the tour?" he said, pausing before adding "Well you call Rupert now and tell him I do want you to come!", which is how Christopher found himself in Milwaukee, Kansas, on June 8.

"You know going on tour is not like country life, Chrissie," commented Mick Jagger on his first day, and it certainly did turn out to be an eyopener, with Christopher accompanying the band on their three-month tour of North America and Canada, playing 40 shows in 27 cities. "The first show I attended," he remembers, "they didn't have a security pass for me as I'd just arrived, so they put me to stand at the back of the stage in the huge outdoor arena. I kept pinching myself to remind myself that I was really there, and when the band walked on, and struck up the opening bars of Honkytonk Woman, I felt the hairs standing up on my arms!" The photographs that he took over the next few months were for use in a tour diary that was to be published the following year, and this exhibition showcases a selection of the best of them. They are a unique record of a memorable occasion.

This is a fantastic opportunity to see Christopher's behind-the-scenes images of the Rolling Stones from the 1975 tour, displayed in the Courtyard Room at Sledmere, for a limited time only.


