I am writing this on returning from a visit to the Foxholes community hall with Kevin Hollinrake MP and two representatives from the Environment Agency where we listened to the views of residents and tried to address questions on a possible planning application, which may at some time in the future be lodged with North Yorkshire Council.

One of the concerns raised was around the watercourse that runs along the Wolds. I've always been interested in the Gipsey Race and worked with Wolds Parish Councils to find solutions around maintenance of this important watercourse. The debate raised both during, and informally after the meeting was interesting. At my northern side of the valley, we have "Gipsey Springs" a colloquial term for small springs that pop up all over the place when the water table becomes high. I had presumed that the term "Gipsey" in relation to the springs and the Wolds race, referred to the nomadic nature of the water, however several years ago, a wise man pointed out to me that "Gipsey" was a reference to the soft sedimentary layer of rock "Gypsum" which caused the water to act within the rock strata in a similar fashion to an artisan well. I confess to being no expert geologist, so I did what everyone does and made reference to Google. According to Wikipedia, the word "Gipsey" in relation to the Wolds Gipsey Race, cites the term as being from the Old English "Gypsia" meaning to suddenly spring into life.

Whatever the origins of the name, what is for certain is the local knowledge around the behaviour of this watercourse and the importance it has to the local community. NYC and the Wolds Parish Councils have for several years been working together to maintain the Gipsey Race and we will continue to ensure it is protected in the future.





Recently it's been mostly gannets ... an early morning trip to RSPB Bempton Cliffs ... it was the usual visual extravaganza ... mayhem and order in equal measures ... got to jubilee corner for the first time ... the fledgling gannets ... gugas ... are bigger than their parents at

this stage of the year ... and weigh more ... so if junior wants to exercise their wings there is very little room on the ledge for adult and child ... concentrated on recording pairs or small groups rather than colony soundscapes ... managed plenty of guttural calls ... with the usual tumult in the background ... some facts ... the birds don't have a brood patch ... keep the eggs warm with their feet ... the earliest gannets were in the late 1960s ... 1969 there were 22 pairs ...

So, from land to sea ... RSPB puffins and gannets cruise ... leaving Bridlington ... under the cliffs at Bempton ... then out into the deep blue ... ish ... lots of mackerel smacking into the brine ... it was astonishing ... gannets circling before plunging...diving coming in at all angles ... leaving their slipstream trails so close to the boat ... flying at eye level ... good grief it was exhilarating ... steady my beating heart ...


