A View from County Hall



Four times a year, we have a dedicated executive meeting to look at the performance of NYC. The quarter 1 performance report covers the period 1st April 2025 to the 30th June 2025 and provides a comprehensive picture of performance across North Yorkshire Council. The Scrutiny Board are the key interrogators of both executive portfolio holders and officers alike and their cross examination of the seventy page performance report is always rigorous.

This quarter, the report took a new shape, no longer putting everything into siloed directorates but recognising that since moving into a unitary authority, each directorate has a cross cutting impact on the whole of county business. Housing has a clear impact on health, and housing impacts on our communities. A wide range of questions were raised by Scrutiny Committee members including matters on Homelessness, Planning performance, Fly tipping, missed bins collection and Children's Social Care.

Attention was drawn to the recent heatwaves in respect of the elderly both living in our communities and in particular, those in residential care homes. As we come out of the fourth heatwave of the summer, I am devastated to see the moorland fires raging at the northern area of the division I represent. I don't think any of us have escaped the acrid smell of smoke that has been hanging over us and the yellow haze blocking out the sun, constantly reminding us of the inevitable destruction of wildlife and a precious ecosystem. This "Major Incident" will also have intense scrutiny and there will be lessons to learn for both sides of the valley. I am sure we all feel for the land owners, wildlife and fauna affected by the fires and I would like to pass on very sincere thanks and appreciation to all who have been working tirelessly to bring this fire under control.



Helperthorpe Bird Notes

*An occasional series from a local birder
and sound recordist.*



Finished my BTO Breeding Bird Survey some time ago ... the annual report for 2024 hit the doormat recently ... as usual the trends are not good for many species ... it's all % and numbers ... former ubiquitous birds ... yellowhammer ... yellow wagtail ... skylark ... even chaffinch ... seem on the decline ... habitat loss being cited ... while bird disease trichotomies accounts for the last species ... and yet a light shines for some ... marsh harrier and bittern ... In other places turtle dove legislation for anti-poaching is faltering ... while the European Commission has re-opened the hunting season for these birds ... Thanks to a local phone call ... my understanding of pheasant husbandry has improved ... had heard of 'walking the birds in' of an evening ... now have a sound recording of them being 'whistled in' for feeding in the early hours of the morning ... intriguing...

The annual visit to the National Centre for birds of prey ... Duncombe Park ... usual great displays of the birds being worked ... a pair of red-footed falcons ... a very rare visitor to these shores ... was eye popping ... continual aerial manoeuvres with a shrieking soundtrack ideally captured on the mic used for commentary by the falconer ...



Neighbour found a very large insect ... which after much searching the t'internet ... identified as a greater horntail wasp ... or a giant wood wasp ... to confuse the issue it's a member of the sawfly family ... its seemingly intimidating sting is actually

its ovipositor ... they are very common species ... feeding on soft or decaying wood ... sadly no sound recording was made ...

So into autumn ... and hopefully ... pink footed geese ...


