It confirmed what many of us in rural areas like North & East Yorkshire have always passionately known: if we care about the nation's food, our countryside and the jobs that sustain it, we must appreciate our farmers.

Let's start with the new tax. By the Government's own trajectory, it's set to raise around £500 million in the final year of this Parliament - small change for the Treasury, but a body-blow for the people who feed us. It's a pernicious and ill-conceived policy because it strikes at an industry already living with tight margins, volatile weather and a global market that can turn on a headline. It also undermines a fundamental conservative principle: that people who have worked hard, often for generations, should be able to pass on their land and their businesses to the next generation. This isn't just about economics; it's about family, legacy and the very continuity of our communities.

This policy is not a niche worry. It is an attack on rural areas, our way of life, our jobs and our income. It won't just hit farmers. It will ripple through vets, mechanics, feed merchants, hospitality, haulage and tourism: whole swathes of the countryside economy. This matters because food security isn't a slogan. It's the difference between resilience and vulnerability. A serious country should want a more self-reliant, circular food economy where more of the food pound stays here, working our land and paying our neighbours, not leaking out to foreign producers because domestic policy made home production unviable.

Worse, it lands alongside a pattern of proposals that misunderstand the realities of land management, from changes to shotgun laws that would undermine vermin control and the country sports that support rural businesses; deep-peat redclassification that risks expanding unmanaged moorland and raising fire risk; and institutions charged with conservation and nature that somehow lack farmers at their most senior tables. Decision-making about the land should include those who know how to care for it.

Farmers are not a special interest group; they are stewards of much of our nation. I challenge anyone to find more varied and beautiful farmland in Europe: and it exists because people work it. What troubles me most is the apparent direction of travel. Labour either does not value farming as a cornerstone of this country or has fundamentally misunderstood its importance. That is wrong. We should back the people who already produce our food to do more of it here, better paid and better protected.

The Conservatives think this is wrong, and Kemi Badenoch has been clear: if we are successful in 2029, we will repeal this legislation as one of our first acts, restoring the status quo and then going further to put British agriculture on a stronger footing than before. All this comes as we approach the Budget. The Chancellor, Rachel Reeves, has little room left and having already alienated farmers, one must ask, who's next when the sums don't add up? This is the moment to choose resilience over rhetoric. I will keep fighting and you should keep fighting, whether big or small, and as Edmund Burke put it, "Nobody made a greater mistake than he who did nothing because he could do only a little."

and sound recordist.*



Have been sound recording chiffchaffs most of the summer ... they arrive in a blur of frenetic energy feeding up after their migration ... recording their calls ... twitterings ... sub song and song ... they will depart with much the same flurry and sound ... if you were with a bird ringer .. on catching one he would blow on its belly feathers ... they would part to reveal layers of yellow fat ... fuel for the trip ... adults first to depart ... the juveniles later ... travelling at night ... heading for Portugal ... Morocco ... some head south beyond the Sahara ... some will over winter in the UK ...

How do they navigate such distances? They use ...

skylight polarisation ... star patterns ... magneticoreception ... easy for you to say ... geophony ... sounds originating from natural sources ... the actual construction of an eye ... the sense of smell for some birds and plain old follow the sun...let's wish them well...

Many thanks to a local resident for a video clip ... a stately grey heron lands ... makes its way to a pond ... quickly stabs a fish ... then promptly belly flops into the water with prey ... a ruffle of feathers ... a moment of composure ... then gone ...

On the patch ... various flocks are moving through ... linnets and goldfinches in 50+ numbers ... chiffchaffs with up to 10 on occasions ... two buzzards alighting on road kill ... mixed groups of great and blue tits ... sometimes with a goldcrest ... kestrel and golden plover ... little owls have been heard as well ... And to end ... an annual quick plug for the Filey bird report 2023 ... absolutely excellent ... that excellence comes at a cost ... £15.


